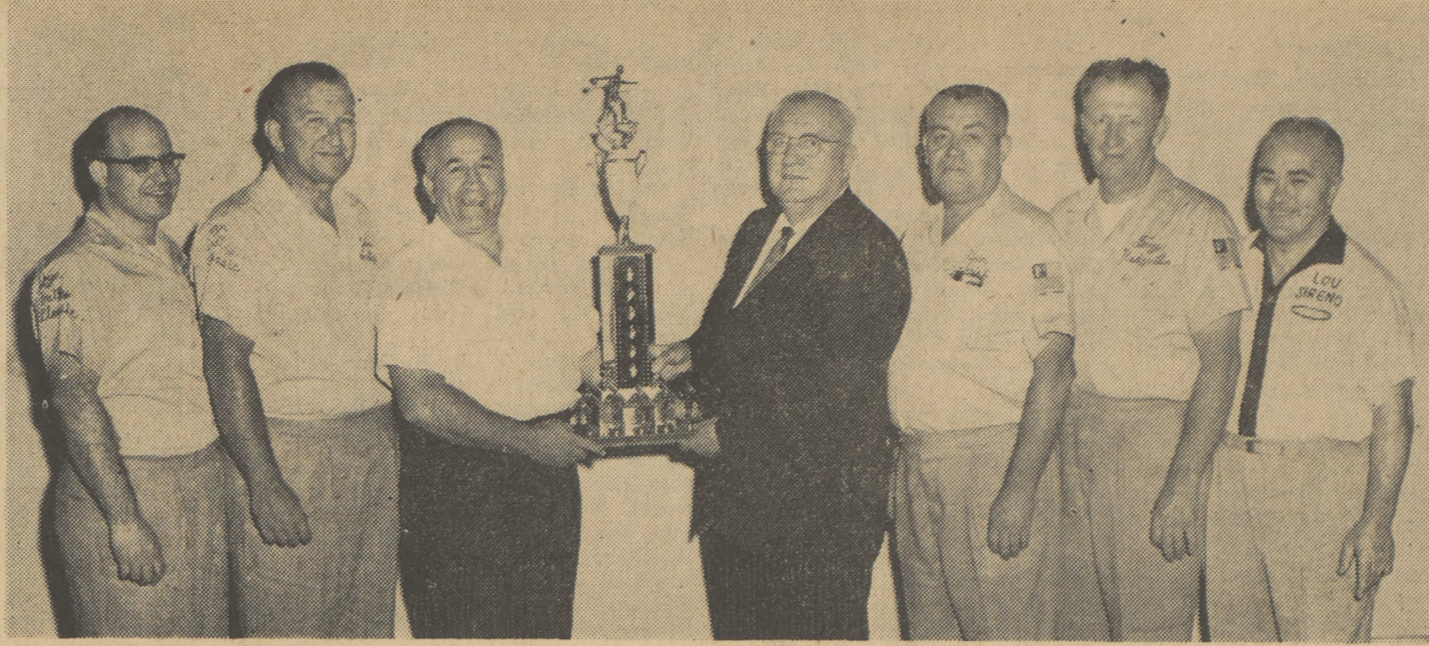
### Campbell Soup Honors Edward Thompson, Dallas

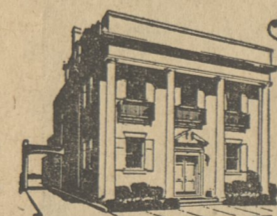

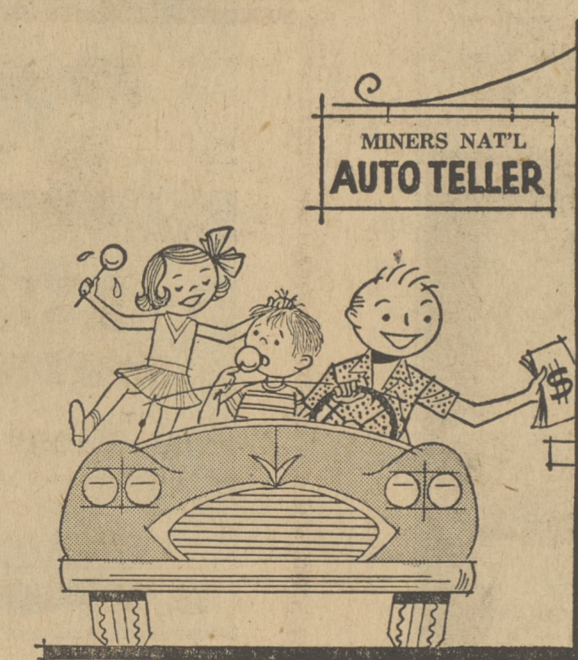
