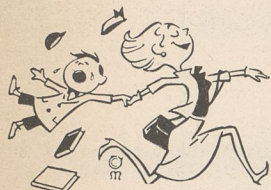

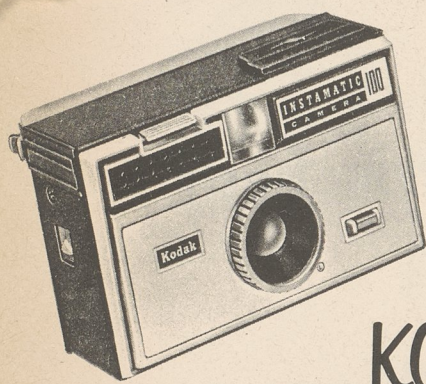
The "Troubador" which was begun last year also holds promise of becoming a bi-monthly magazine. It consists of student contributions in the field of art, poetry, short stories and essays.
