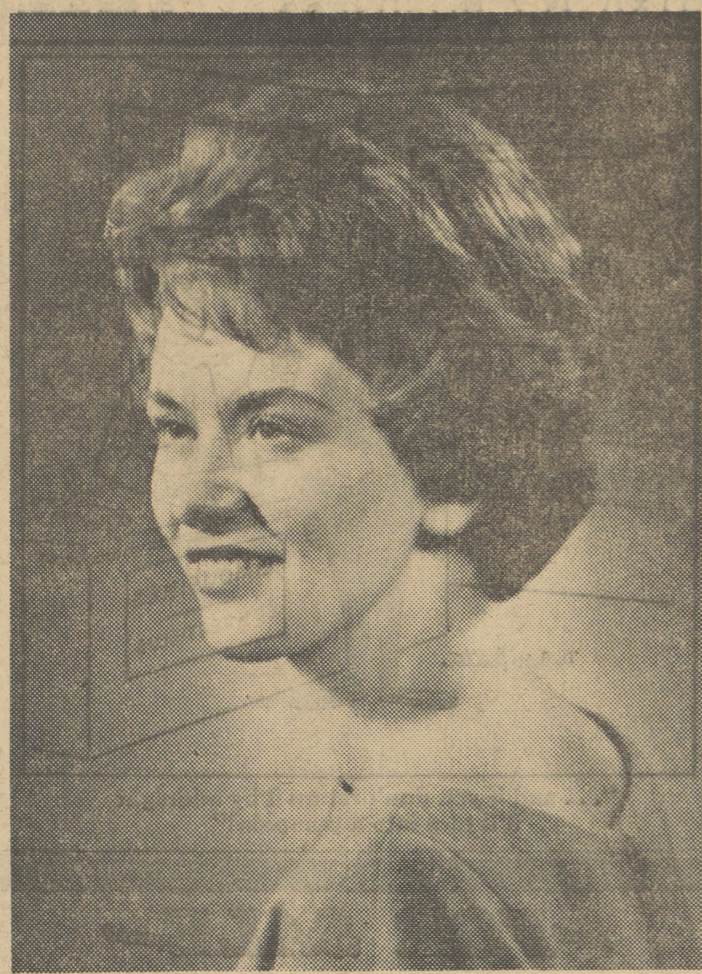
Stoughton was recently promoted to his present rank. He is the son of Mrs. Edna Stoughton, Eley Street, Kingston and the late L. E. Stoughton.

Third Child Born To The Lemmonds

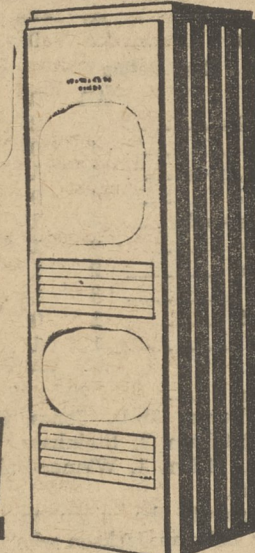

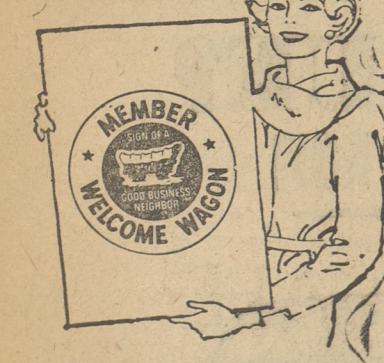

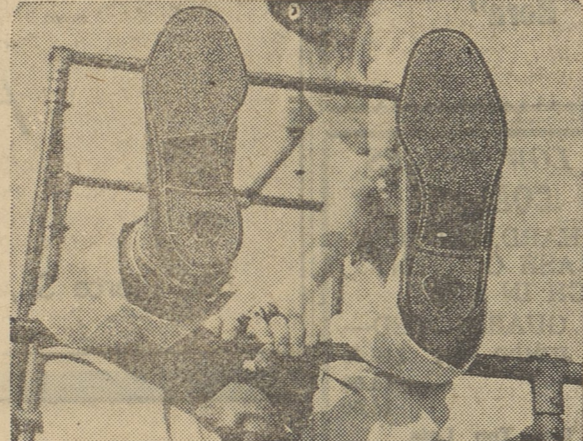
