The esteem in which he was held was evidenced by the large group of friends and associates who gathered to pay final tribute to Raymond W. Beck, 48, Huntsville Road, Trucksville, who died last Sunday morning in Nesbitt Hospital.

### Mother Of Architect Was Music Teacher

The entire community was saddened yesterday morning to learn of the death of Mrs. Evelyn Hauck, 68, Perrin Avenue, Shavertown, Wednesday evening at Cancer Memorial Hospital, New York City.

Mrs. Hauck, mother of Lester Hauck, prominent architect and Kingston Township Supervisor, was stricken ill several months ago and had waged a valiant battle against overwhelming odds. Hospitalized at General for a number of weeks, she was removed to the New York Medical Center the first week in July, where she underwent four operations. She had made progress until the past week when she slipped into a coma.
