Mrs. Emily Scott, 77, Has Happy Birthday

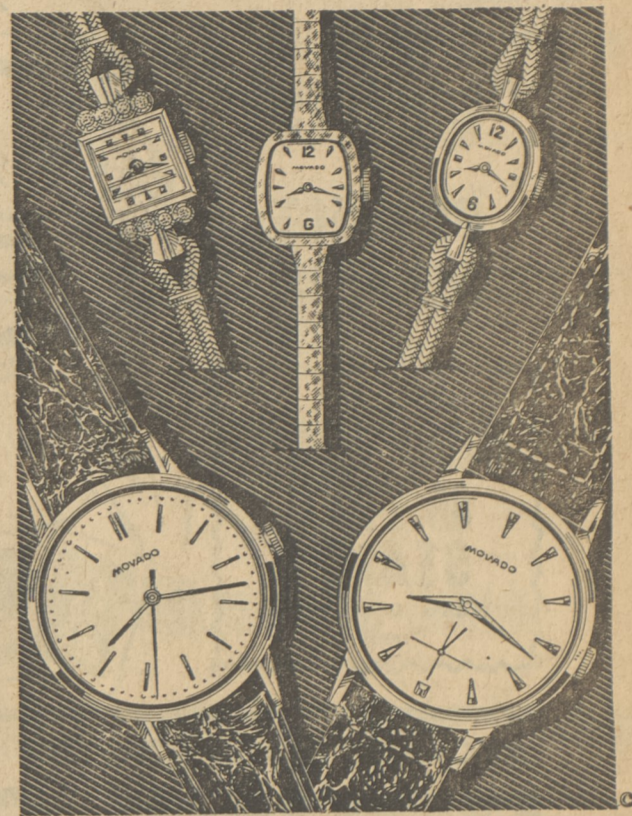
