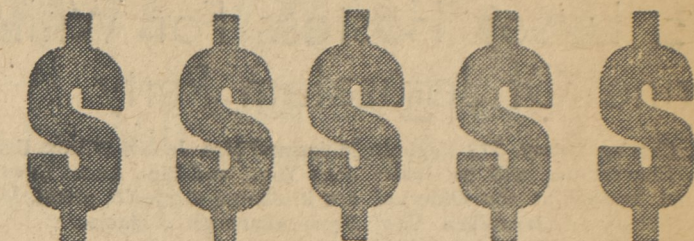
Don't Panic, Advises Veteran Bus Driver

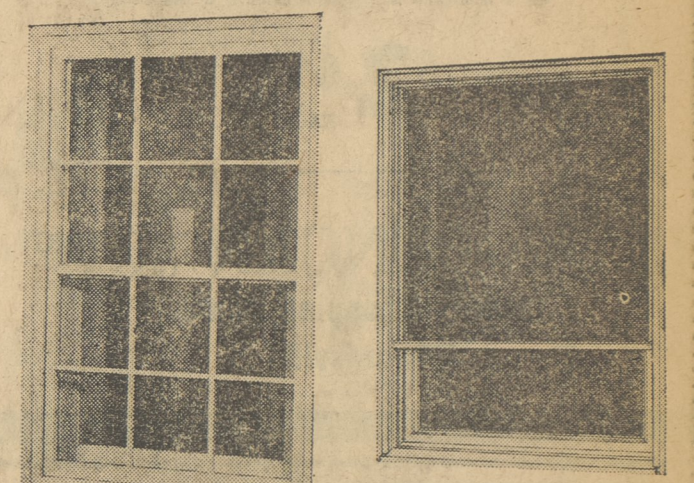

That the Committee on Ways and Means, House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., proposes to eliminate from Federal Income Tax deduction

- STATE GASOLINE TAX
- AUTO REGISTRATION FEES
- DRIVER LICENSE FEES

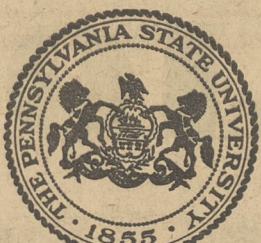
