### Paul E. Dugan, Huntsville Soldier Takes Karla Matthews As Bride

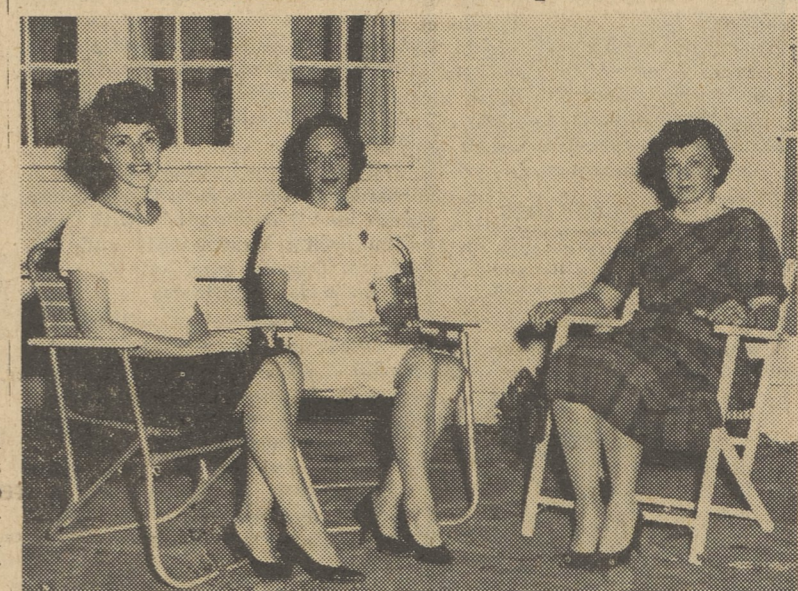
