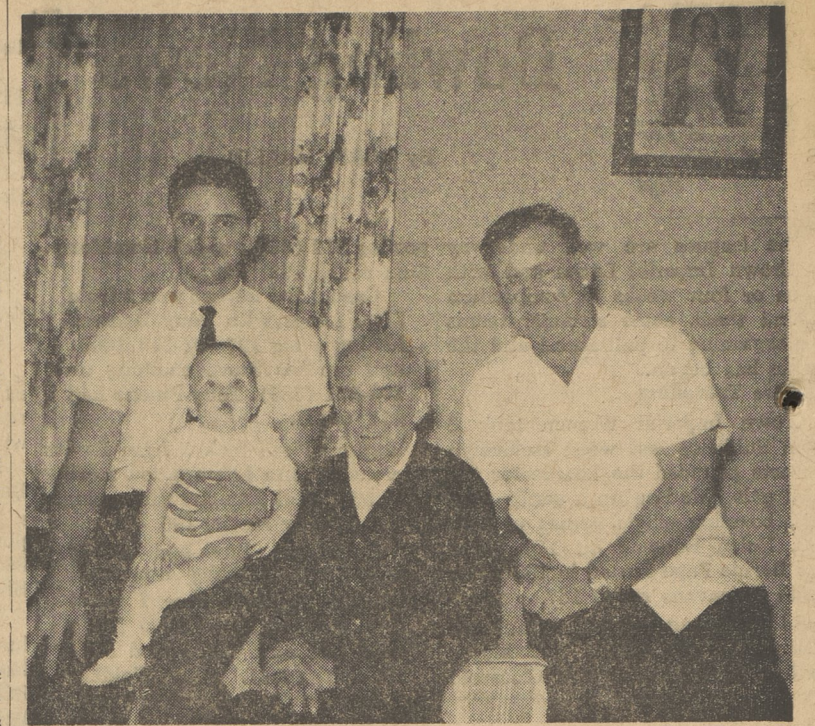
A reception at Wahoo Inn, Harvey's Lake will follow the ceremony.

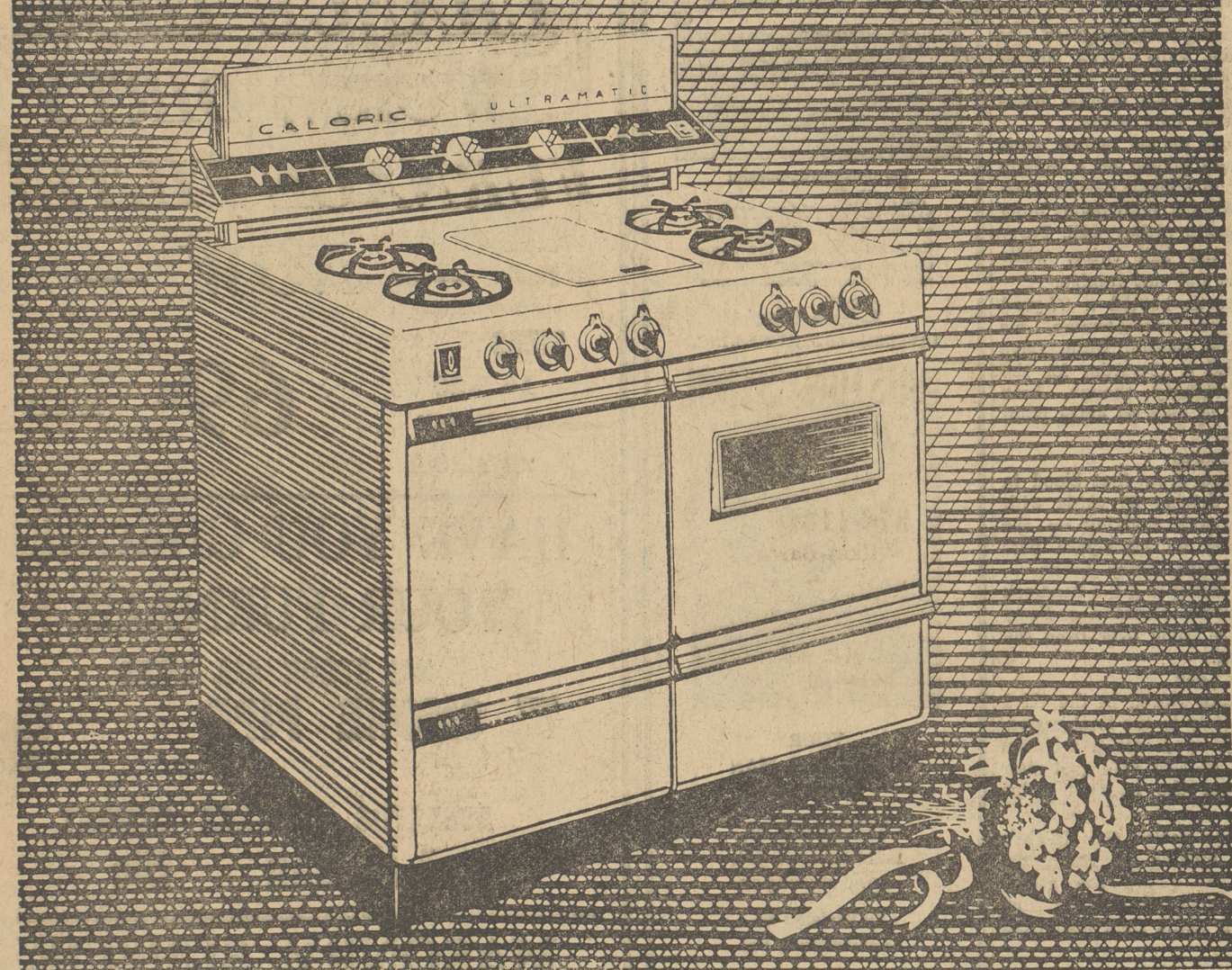
