Schools will again participate in the United Fund program.

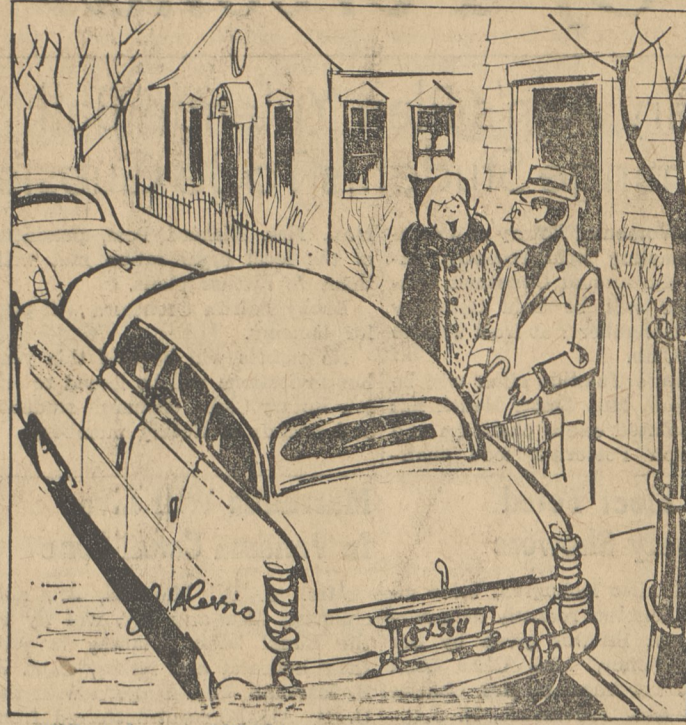
