Initiation of the new members in the Key Club will be held the week of October 21.

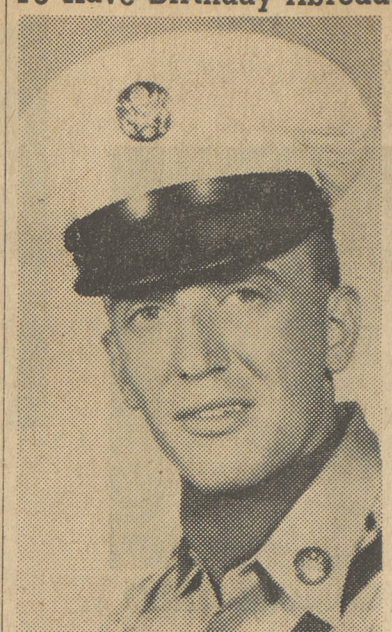
Last Thursday, Attorney Andrew Hourigan, a graduate of Princeton, gave a talk to senior boys interested in College.
