Lester Squier, Robert Belles and Anthony Marchakitus introduced Faculty Custodians and cafeteria workers.

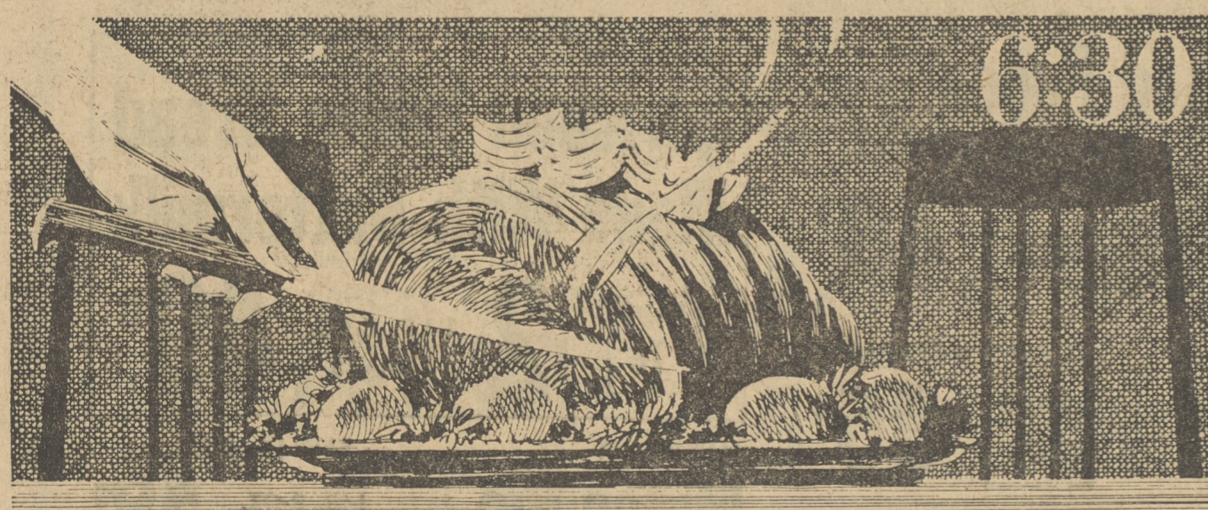
Samuel Davenport introduced Mrs. Norman Patton, who discussed "Pennsylvania's Constitution - Good, Bad, or Indifferent"

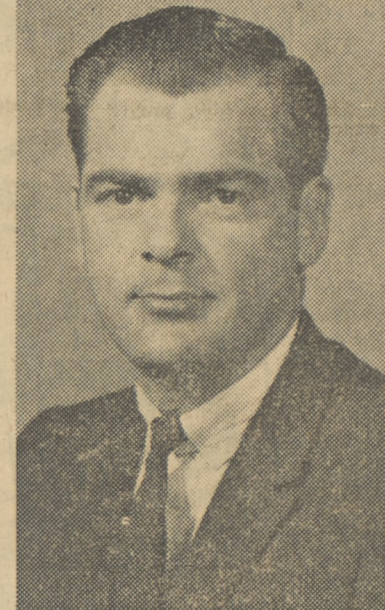
