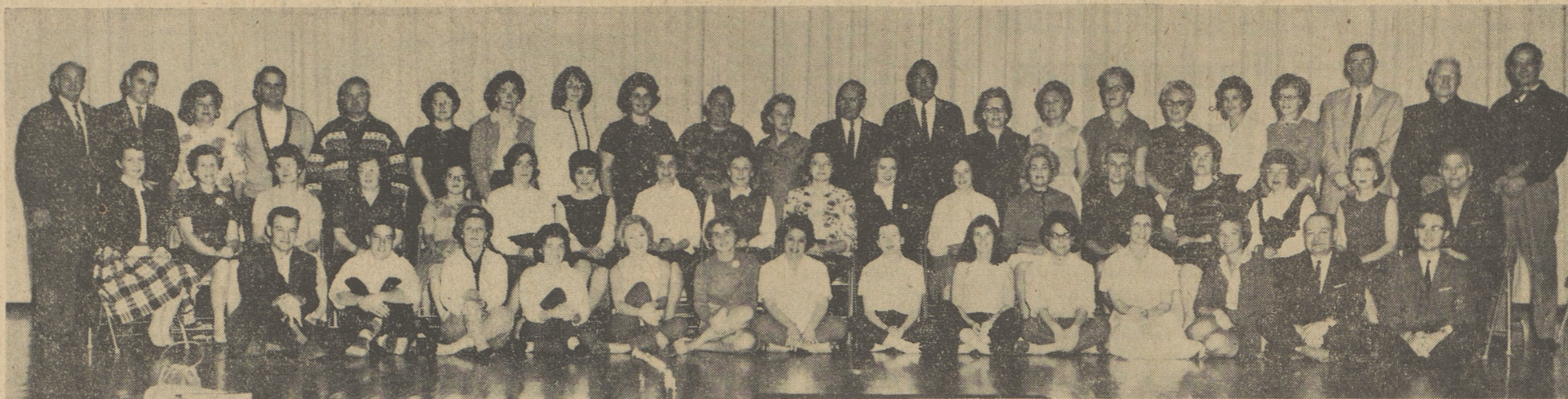
Guesses The Whatsit
