## Dallas Travels To Northwest; Lake-Lehman To Test Luzerne

With the current grid season coming to a close a week from now, both Back Mountain grid teams are looking for a winning season.

Dallas, unbeaten but twice tied, is hoping to retain its West Side Conference crown while Lake-Lehman with a (4-3) slate is hopeful of winning its two remaining contests to complete a successful season.

Next week, Dallas meets Wyoming and Lake-Lehman closes out at home with West Wyoming.

**Dallas-Northwest** Dallas should extend its present win streak to 16 in this one. Dallas, unbeaten in its last 19 outings including four ties, has rolled up 265 points while yielding just 75, blanking 10 opponents.

Northwest, winless in eight games, has one of its largest squads in years, mostly underclassmen, and with new coach Joe Charney, former West Wyoming grizzer, the Rangers have found the going tough and a look at scoring statistics show Northwest has scored but 43 points compared to 162 for the opposition.

**Lake-Lehman-Luzerne** Lake-Lehman (4-3), including an upset win over Exeter in its current two game win streak, will have its hands full Saturday afternoon when it meets Luzerne at Connolly field.

Luzerne (6-3) has had a fine season thus far, playing mostly WSC foes although not actually an official conference member. The Lions have a big line and a fine array of backs so the Knights' defensive alignment will have to be at its peak if they are to win their third in a row and be assured of a winning season.

Fans will most likely see an aerial attack by the Knights featuring the passing of quarterback Larry Lettie.

**May Be Of Interest** While most Back Mountain fans have been focusing their attention to the present winning streak of Dallas Mountaineers over the past three seasons and an overall record of 18 wins, 2 losses and 4 ties during that time, just a reminder to grid fans that neighboring Lake-Lehman has been playing some pretty good football also.

Over the same period, Lake-Lehman has compiled a record of 15 wins, 8 losses and 4 ties. The four ties were played during the 1961 season.

**15 Straight** Dallas extended its winning streak to 15 Saturday afternoon by downing a supposedly strong Luzerne eleven, 12-0. Some 2,000 chilled onlookers watched the game, sitting out a mild blizzard during the second quarter, that ended just before halftime.

Dallas scored its winning points on drives of 27 and 47 yards in the second and third periods. Luzerne, which moved at ease at the outset of the game, failed to get inside the Dallas 30 yard line.

**Both Teams Threaten** In a game that was to feature two big lines against one another, Luzerne looked as though it was going to have an easy time moving against the Dallas defense as it put the kick-off in play at the 39. The Lions then moved for three first downs to reach the Dallas 34 before the forward wall stiffened and forced the Lions to punt into a strong wind.

Martino and Kovalick were the top gainers in the drive for the Lions along with a Matukonis to Kovalick pass good for a first down. A short punt was put in play at the 21 by Dallas.

On first down, fullback Joe Noon cracked through the line and found daylight as he scampered to the Luzerne 35 before being hauled down from behind by Kulka.

On the next play, Farley slanted off-tackle for an 11-yard gain to the 24, and it looked as though Dallas would eat the Lions up.

A penalty and a run by Farley placed the pigskin at the Luzerne 14. After a penalty and a four yard loss by Baker moved the ball back to the 23, the Lions' defense tightened and three passes went (Continued on Page 6 A)
