**Kiwanis Women Meet With Men's Group**

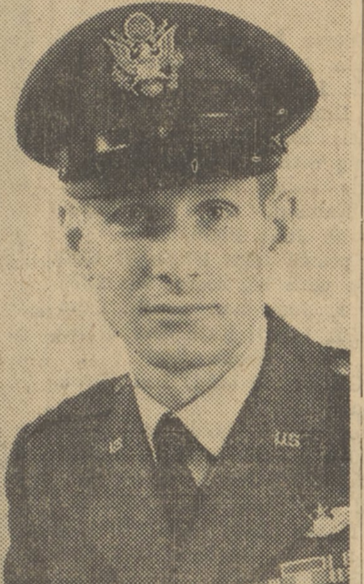
A combined dinner and program with the men's club was held recently by Dallas Women of Kiwanis.
