Bill To Exempt Amish From Social Security

Nov. 6 — Rep. Richard S. Schweiker recently introduced legislation exempting persons such as the Old Order Amish from participation in the federal Social Security program.

The Schweiker bill would permit members of churches whose established doctrines forbid participation in such programs on religious grounds to waive their benefit rights and be exempted from social security taxes.

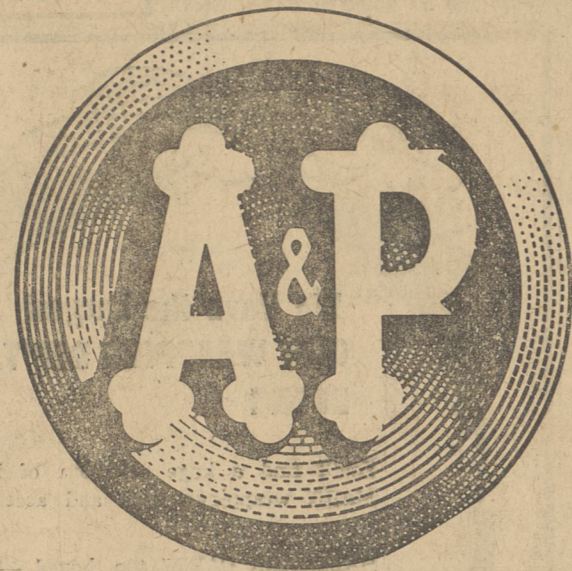
Applicants for exemption would be asked to show that members of their faith make adequate provision for elderly members to prevent their needing any public aid in their later years.
