On the eighteenth, D. Bolton led the scoring with 220 (575). Demmy hit 551, B. Guyette 205, Kardell 215.

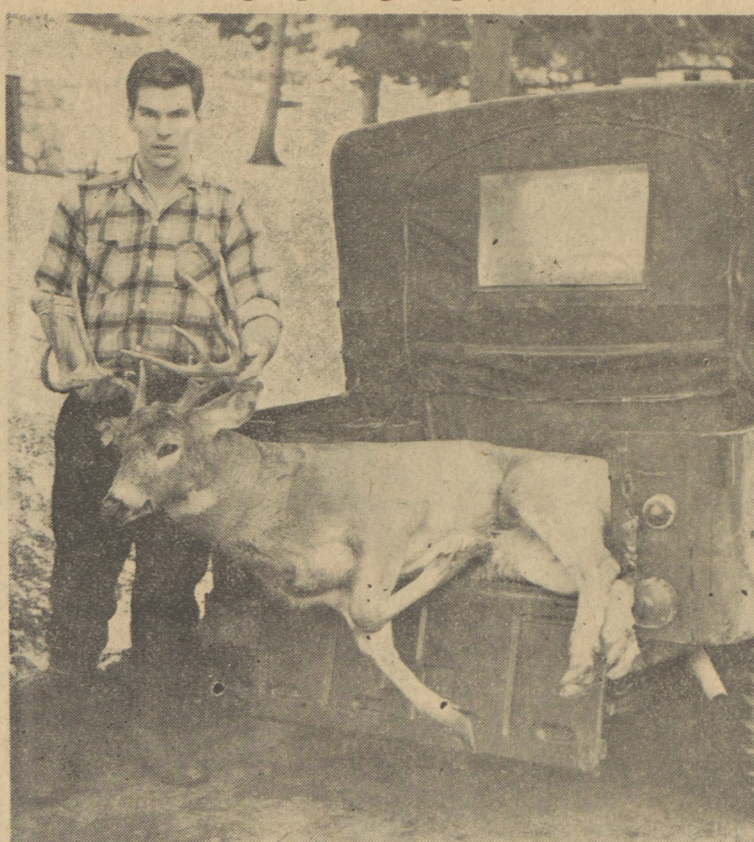
Last week, the men were down with no one hitting over 550. Titman posted a 211, Kostrobala hit 219, Zachary 208 and Demmy 210.
