**Trinity United Presbyterians Pledge \$65,000 Toward Edifice**  
Sunday's Every Member Canvass, carried out by Trinity United Presbyterian Church, netted the funds needed for construction of the first unit of the proposed edifice.  
Members of the congregation of the new church, now numbering 175, pledged \$65,000. The National Board of Missions will contribute \$50,000 toward the structure.

It affords a far-reaching view of the area, overlooking Dallas Junior High School and College Misericordia, a prime location for the Back Mountain's newest church.  
The congregation has been meeting at Dallas Junior High School, adjacent to the property acquired for its permanent home. A large sign marks the spot where the building will rise.  
Foundation of Trinity Presbyterian Church is another milestone in the development of the Back Mountain.
