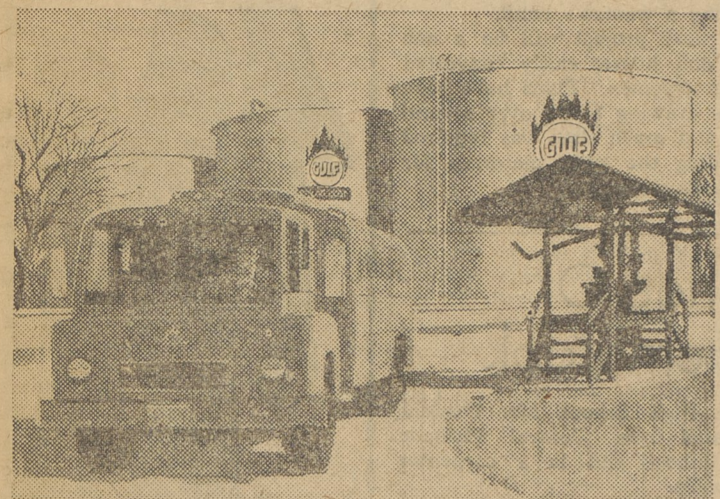


Bowling News
