According to a report by Juvenile Judge Sam Tatum of Nashvville, Tennessee-of the 46,000 juvenile cases he tried in Juvenile Court over a period of twenty-five years, only one family in every 2,700 problem cases attended religious classes or worshipped together as a family. Just seventeen families who took worship seriously were involved in all of the 46,000 trials.

Statistics such as these certainly speak volumes for families who do "worship together each week." Seeing that "they" go just isn't enough. Here's one area in which participation by all members is called for. Show your children the way to a richer, fuller life this week by joining them in worship.


