ORDINANCE NO. 1 AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF DALLAS, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, fixing the tax rate for the fiscal year 1964.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the Council of the Borough of Dallas, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania:

SECTION 1. That a tax be and the same is hereby levied on all property within the said Borough subject to taxation for Borough purposes for the fiscal year 1964, as follows:

Tax rate for general Borough purposes, the sum of (15) mills on each dollar of assessed valuation; For debt purposes the sum of (3 1/2) mills on each dollar of assessed valuation;

For other purposes, as follows: Light, water and Fire the sum of (3 1/2) mills on each dollar of assessed valuation; Making a total tax rate for all Borough purposes of Twenty-two (22) mills.

ORDINANCE NO. 2 AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF DALLAS, LUZERNE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, LEVYING A PER CAPITA TAX OF FIVE DOLLARS FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 1964.

BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED, pursuant to the authority of the act of June 25, 1947 (P.L. 1145) and its amendments, as follows:
