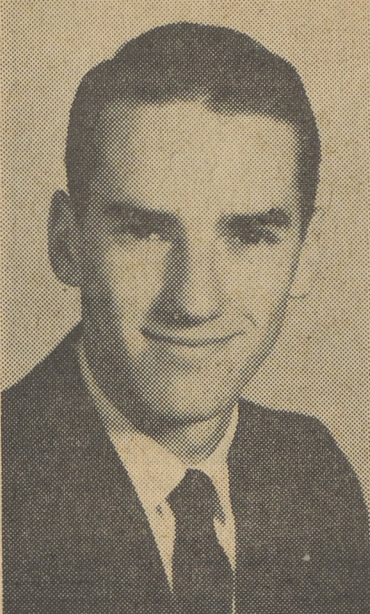


# Jacobs Receives Wrestling Letter
