Messick, 59 Saginaw Street, Dallas, recently promoted to the Civil Air Patrol grade of major, is commander of CAP Group 20 Headquarters in Dallas which is responsible for six CAP squadrons in Northeastern Pennsylvania. The CAP is an Air Force Auxiliary active in air search and rescue and aerospace education.

Maj. Messick is a retired Air Force Captain with 21 years service. A 14-year CAP veteran, Maj. Messick, who is a rated CAP pilot, has served as an operations officer in the Colorado CAP Wing and a squadron commander in Main and Florida CAP Wings.
