Mr. Jacobs is a member of the Dallas Rotary and of the Shavertown Methodist Church.

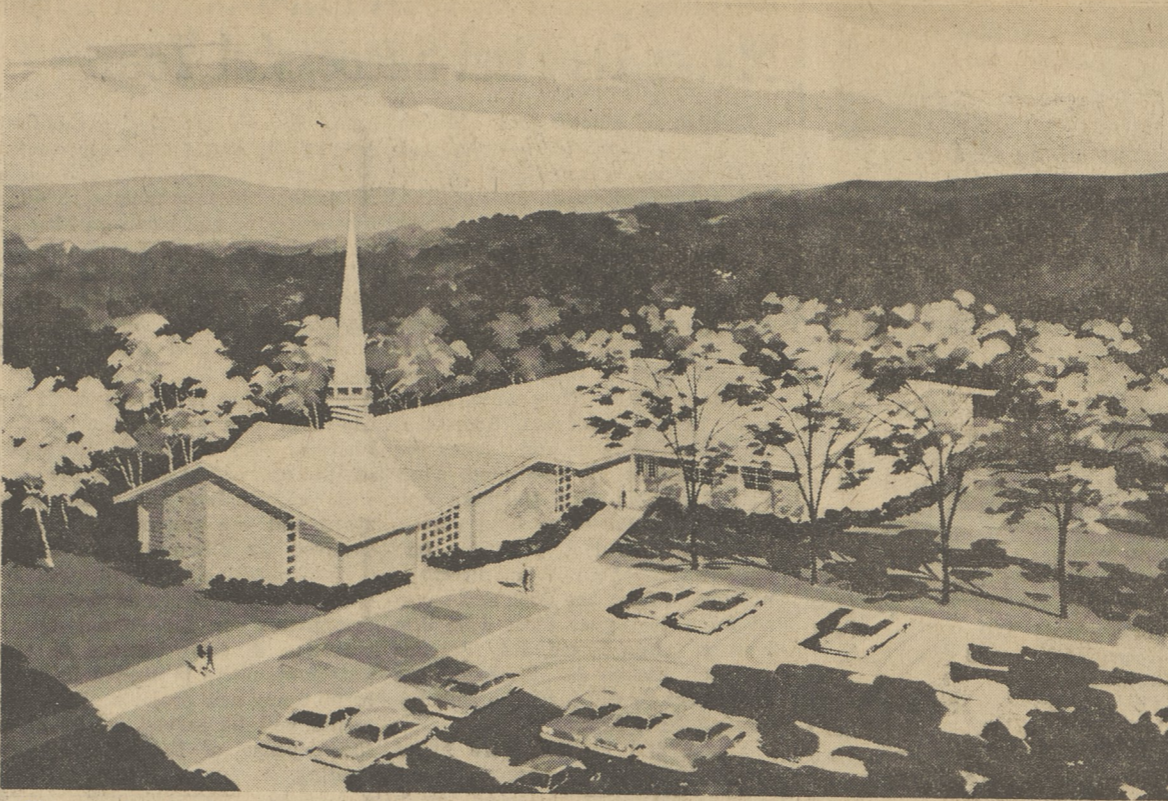
**Requiem Mass For Native Of Poland**

## Architect's Conception Of The Proposed Trinity Presbyterian Edifice



This is the Presbyterian church which will rise on a high hill overlooking Dallas, a beautiful location decided upon when the congregation was formed in April of 1961.  
A petition signed by 150 residents of the Back Mountain was presented to the Presbytery of Lackawanna, asking for the organization of a Presbyterian Church in Dallas, and a committee was appointed by Presbytery to visit the area.  
The committee unanimously agreed to organize a church, and the first service was held September 24th, 1961, with the Rev. Dr. Peter K. Emmons officiating.  
From November through March, the Rev. Robert Smyrl, Presbytery Executive of Lackawanna Presbytery conducted services.  
In March 1962, the Rev. Andrew Pillarella was sent by the Presbytery of Lackawanna to be the organizing minister.  
In the Dallas Junior High School gymnasium June 10th, 1962, Trinity United Presbyterian Church was organized with 123 charter members and Rev. Pillarella installed as pastor.

Since its organization the church has been growing steadily, meeting temporarily at the Dallas Junior High School.  
In April, 1963, a Building Committee was appointed by the Session of the Church: Mr. Bradford Alden, chairman; Mrs. William Cooper, Sr., Mr. George Davis, Dr. Robert Bodycomb and Mr. Clifford Troup.  
Rev. Pillarella pastor, Rev. Robert Smyrl, Presbytery Executive, Rev. Douglas Vance, Synod Executive, and Elder Harry Hickman, a member of the Strategy Committee of Lackawanna Presbytery sat in with the committee at many of their meetings offering advice and guidance.  
After visiting a number of new church buildings the committee began its work of interviewing archi-

itects. In August 1963, the committee recommended to the session the firm of Allan, Rodda and Hauck for approval. In all of the discussions and planning the basic approach has been to give to the congregation and community a building designed to fulfill present and projected future needs.  
On Sunday, April 19th, a special meeting of the congregation was held to receive and approve recommendations of the Building Committee presented by Mr. Alden.  
Mr. Lester Hauck architect, by means of slides, elevation drawings and a colored rendering presented the plans as recommended by the Building Committee. The plans were unanimously accepted and the architect authorized to begin working drawings as specified.  
A ground breaking ceremony will take place Sunday afternoon June 7th, on a seven acre plot adjacent to the Dallas Junior High School, Church Street, Dallas.
