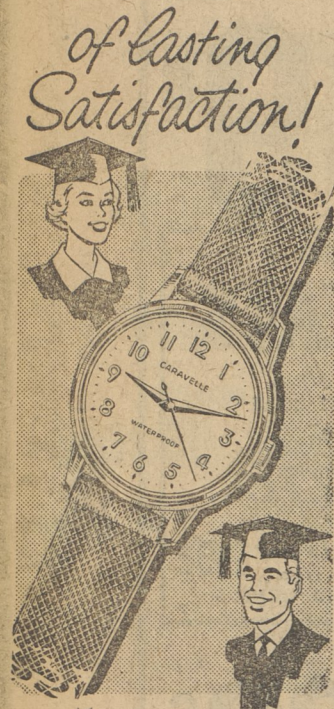


Dallas Fire Drill

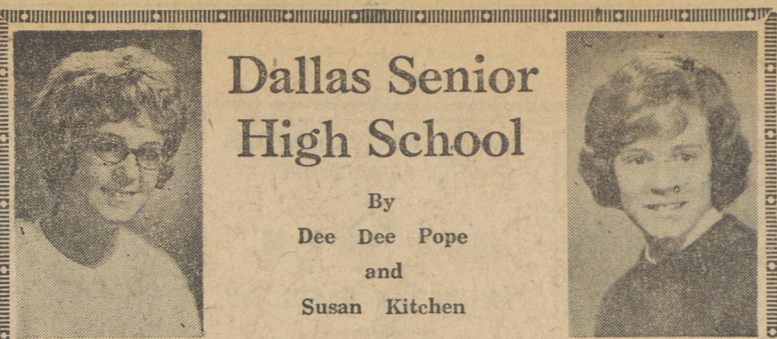

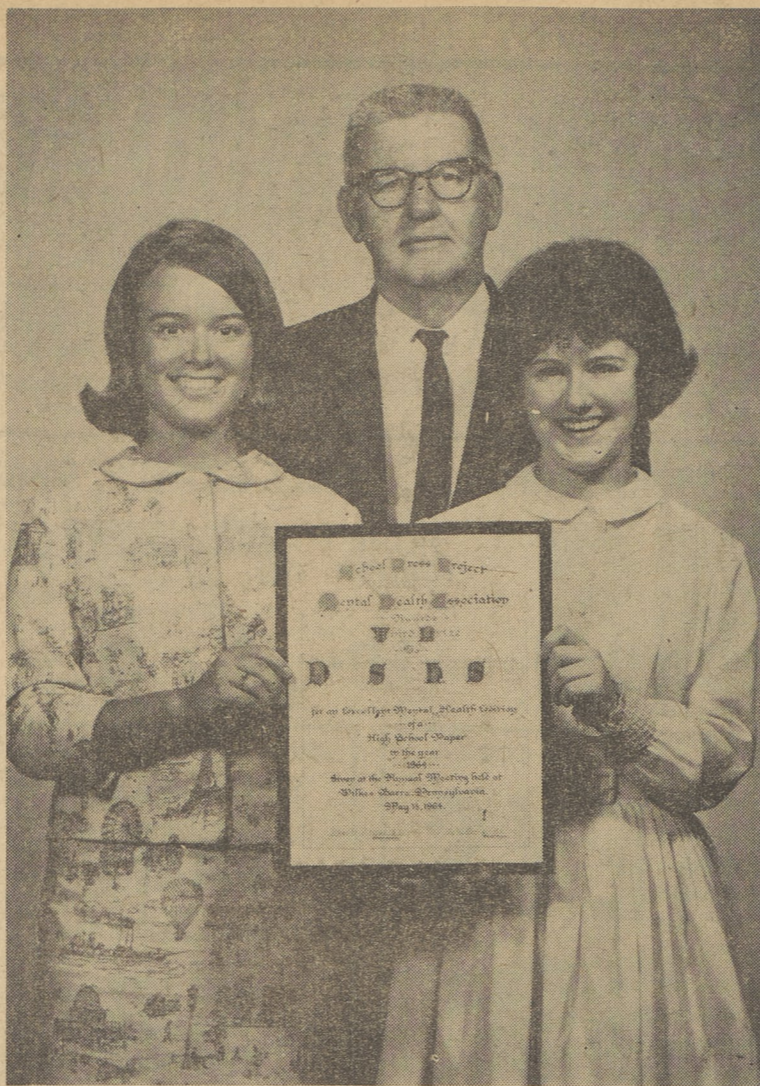
winner went into state competition at State University. Mr. Alan Husband, coach, accompanied the boys.
