Mrs. Harvey is the former Marion Weintz of Meeker, daughter of George Weitz, Lehman and the late Mrs. Edith Weintz.

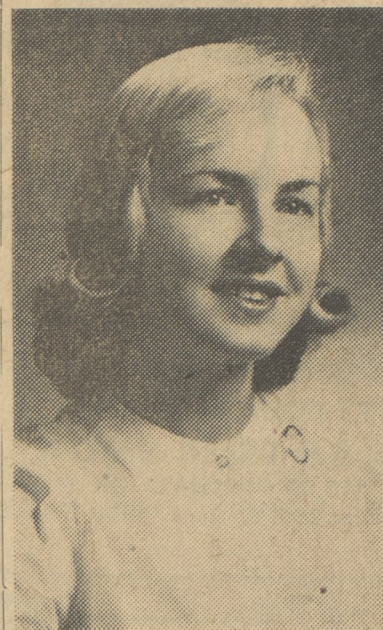
