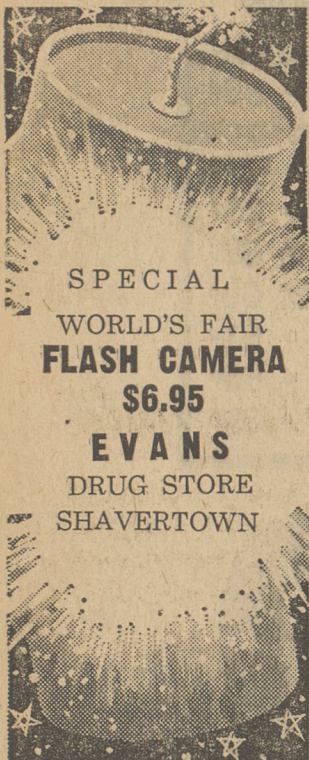
Some of the children are expected to share the special occasion with their dad.
