Doreen Jane Edwards Daren D. Rushnock

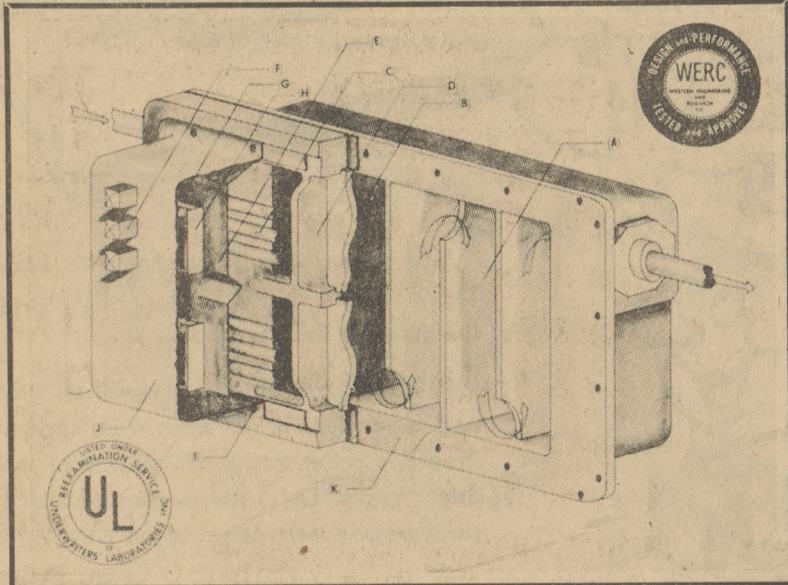

PURIFICATION The raw, clear water enters the purification chamber and flows through a long, winding channel (2" by 3" by 48" long) while being continuously irradiated with ultraviolet rays (ca. 2537Ao) Turbulance in the Flow Chamber Channels (A) assures complete exposure of the water and continuous cleaning of the Lens (B) for maximum efficiency. Ultraviolet radiation is provided in six Germicidal Lamps (C) in parallel circuit separated from the water jacket by the high silica Lens and Retainer Assembly (D). The lamps are backed up by the highly polished aluminum Reflector (E) for maximum utilization of the radiation energy. The Function Indicator Lights (F) come on when one of the germicidal lamps is out of service. Lamps and Starters (G) can be quickly replaced by removing the 20 bolts (I) which hold the Electrical Jacket (J) to the Water Jacket (K). This routine maintenance can be performed in about twenty minutes by untrained personnel.
