Orange Native Crash Victim

Matte 30, Dies Instantly in Car
A former resident of Orange and a graduate of Dallas Township High School was killed Friday morning when his car hit a telephone pole near the Stone Bridge in Forty Fort.

The victim, George Matte, 30, of West Wyoming, died instantly of a fractured skull.

The impact not only uprooted the pole, but wrecked a fire hydrant. The 1956 sedan turned over and rolled 145 feet, coming to rest upside down.

Matte, born in Orange, was son of Andrew and Anna Matte. From 1953 to 1956, he was with the US Army, serving in Korea. For the past five years he was employed by the Trane Company as a machinist.

He leaves his widow, the former Regina Kper; his parents; a son George, four years old; two brothers: Michael, of Buffalo, N. Y.; and Andrew, of Orange; a sister, Mrs. Anna Zarno, Dallas. A brother John was killed in 1950 while serving with the US Army.
