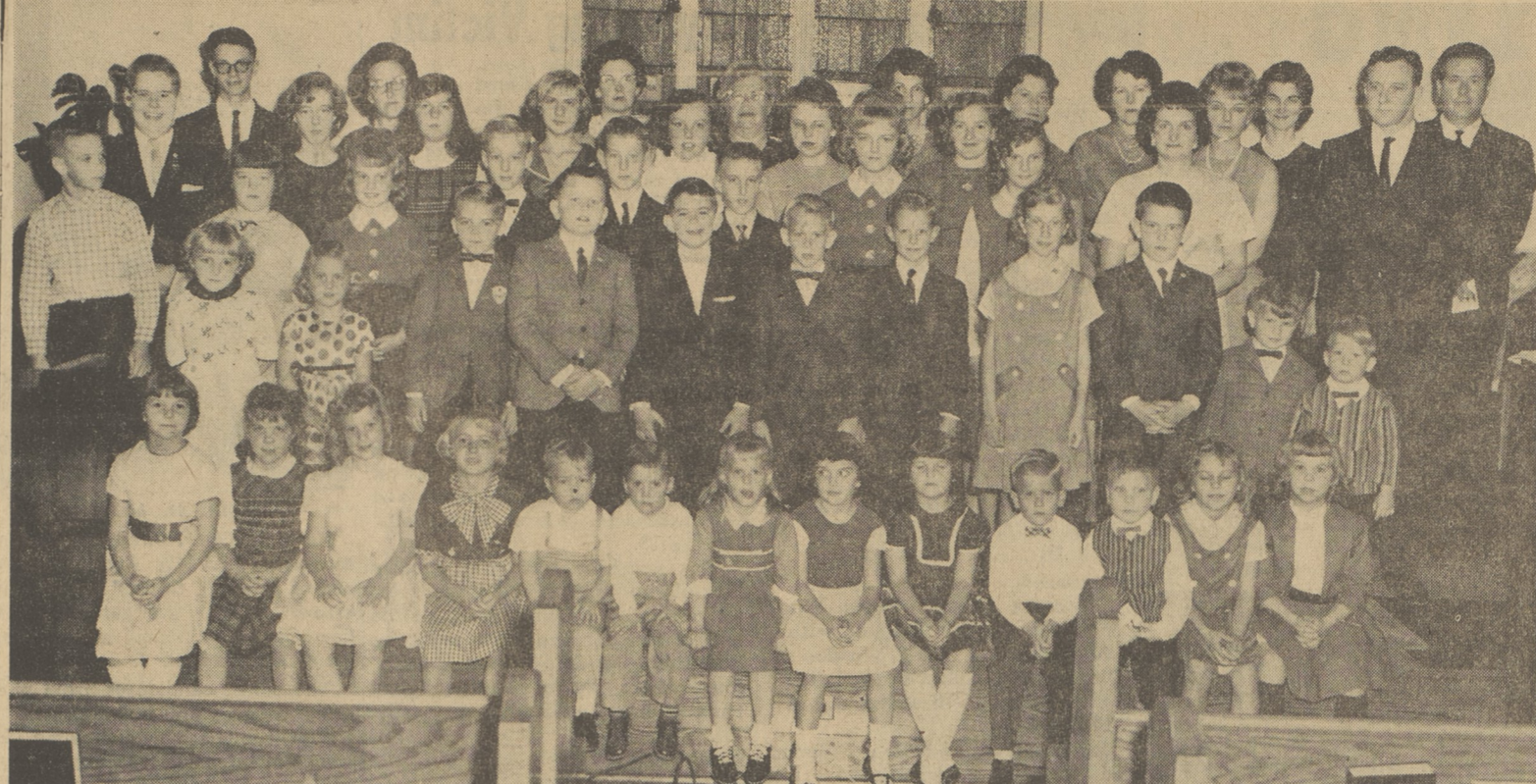
**District Meeting For Presbyterian Women**

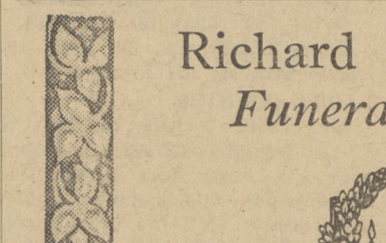
