NECESSITY OF HUNTING DOGS

The conservationists in every state generally look upon the hunting dog as a knight in shining armor. And little wonder. In these days of heavy hunting pressures, shrinking game habitats, and the not overabundant number of waterfowl and game birds, we can no longer afford to shoot down five million ducks each year that are not recovered. Nor can we afford the heavy crippling loss of upland game birds. The use of hunting dogs cuts these losses dramatically by assuring that a greater proportion of the birds shot are actually retrieved and therefore counted by the hunter for his legal limit.



And not only does wild life conservation benefit from hunters using dogs, but you're doing yourself a favor. Half the fun of hunting waterfowl or upland game is watching your dog work. And there's a wide choice of breeds available to any nimrod, no matter what his specialty. Nor must a dog be pedigreed. Many a pooch of uncertain pedigree will hunt with zest and efficiency.

The fact that you live in a city apartment or a small house in the suburbs is no deterrent, providing you can get to the country occasionally for training, and more regularly at least a month before the season opens to get your dog conditioned. Labrador Retrievers, Pointers and Setters are no larger than Boxers or German Shepherds, two breeds that are popular in the cities. True, they'll need long brisk walks, but walking conditions you, too, for long hours in the field. Being prepared physically, you'll get more enjoyment out of your hunting.
