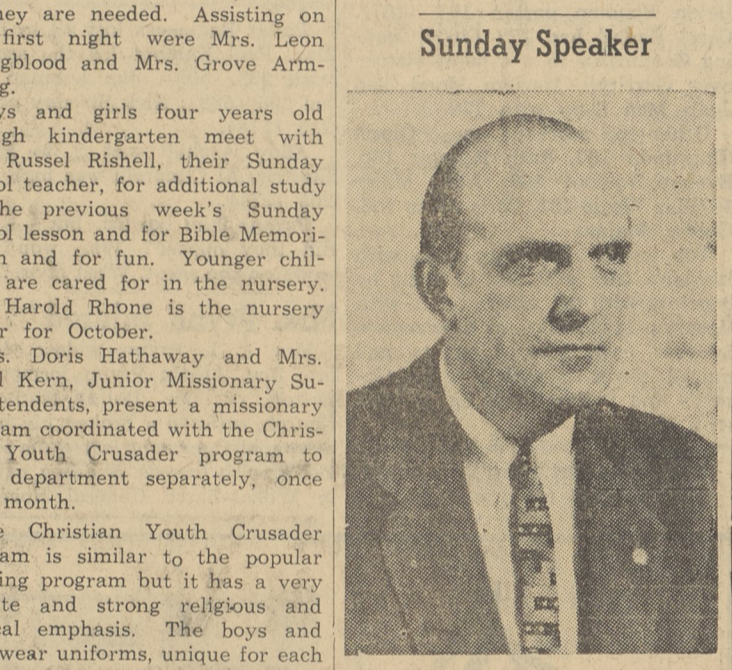
Broadway Methodist Church Plans Home-Coming Sunday, October 25th

 Patterson Grove Camp Meeting, nearby, observed its 96th anniversary this summer, which indicates that Methodists had a congregation there in Broadway nearly a century ago, if not earlier.
 Present minister of Broadway Methodist is Rev. Fred Hickok, who is starting his fifth year as pastor. He was formerly pastor at Weatherly.

Family Night At Park Neighborhood Aimed Toward Freeing Other Nights

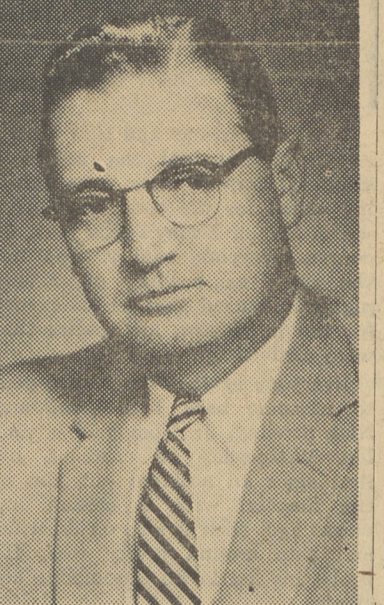
Park Neighborhood Free Methodist Church held its first "Family Night" of the new conference year last Wednesday, and Pastor Armstrong reports that it exceeded all expectations with about ninety persons in attendance.
 The "Family Night" program is designed to meet the needs of all the members of the family. Adults meet in the sanctuary for Bible Study in the book of Romans taught by Pastor Armstrong, and for prayer.
 The Senior-Hi youth, directed by Mr. and Mrs. William Zeek, meet with the adults for Bible Study, then go to the youth room for prayer and Bible Quiz practice.
 Boys and girls from grade one to grade nine participate in a Christian Youth Crusade program which has three separate programs; one for junior-hi youth called the Christian Crusaders, directed by Mr. and Mrs. Wesley Cooper, Jr.; one for grades four through six called the Christian Cadets, directed by Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Atkinson; and one for grades one through three, the Christian Heralds, directed by Mr. and Mrs. Franklin Giberson. These groups meet separately in different areas of the building.
 Directors are assisted by others as they are needed. Assisting on the first night were Mrs. Leon Youngblood and Mrs. Grove Armstrong.
 Boys and girls four years old through kindergarten meet with Mrs. Russel Rishell, their Sunday School teacher, for additional study on the previous week's Sunday School lesson and for Bible Memorization and for fun. Younger children are cared for in the nursery. Mrs. Harold Rhone is the nursery leader for October.
 Mrs. Doris Hathaway and Mrs. Isabel Kern, Junior Missionary Superintendents, present a missionary program coordinated with the Christian Youth Crusader program to each department separately, once each month.
 The Christian Youth Crusader program is similar to the popular scouting program but it has a very definite and strong religious and Biblical emphasis. The boys and girls wear uniforms, unique for each group; earn rank insignia and badges for such activities as Nature Study, Taxidermy, Bible Study, Compass, First Aid, Camping, Bible Reading, Bible Holiness, Sunday School, Church Attendance, etc. Every summer there are Christian Youth Crusader camps in each conference for all registered crusaders in the conference.
 The basic aim of Family Night is to strengthen the family. The leaders of the Park Neighborhood Church feel that if men's meetings are held on one night, ladies on another night, boys and girls, on another night, the youth on yet another, that instead of strengthening the family ties, the church is actually pulling the family apart. Furthermore, when the family is tied up in an abundance of meetings in the church, it is unable to participate in the local community affairs where each family has a Christian responsibility.
 The family night program begins at 7:30 and ends promptly at 8:45. It is held every Wednesday of the month, except the first Wednesday which is the Monthly Business Session. The Family Night is open to anyone in the community wishing to participate.
