### Gate Of Heaven PTG To Fete Faculty

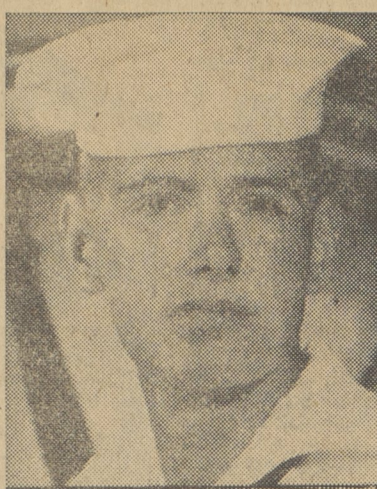

### Students Are Asked To Return Uniforms

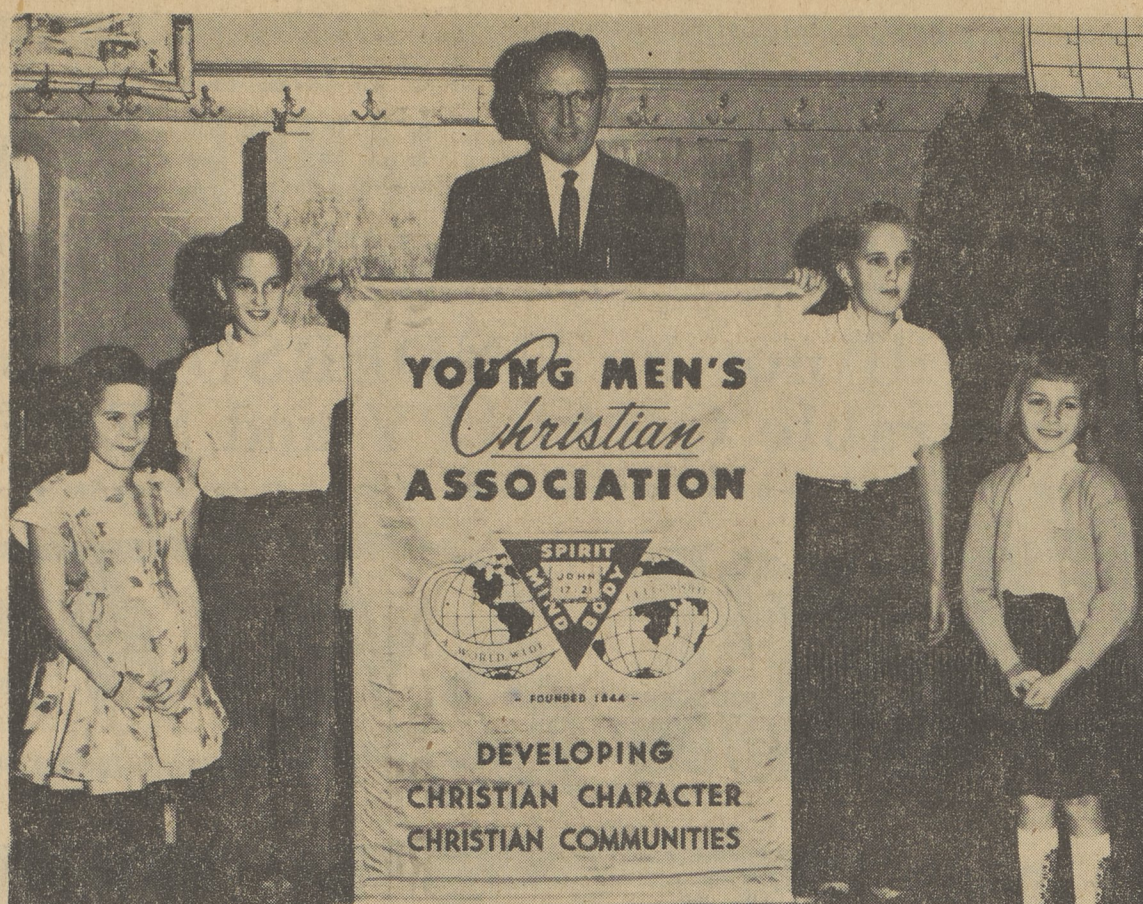

### SPAR Deadline December 31st Is Set By U. S. Coast Guard

Third U. S. Coast Guard District is now reminding all interested young women in its six-state area that the deadline for its recently announced SPAR enlistment pilot projects is Dec. 31.

Applications are currently being accepted for the program, which is designed to meet a current SPAR shortage. Forty women, between the ages of 18 and 30, will be offered the opportunity to spend a year on active duty for specialized career training, and two years as enlisted members of their hometown Coast Guard Organized Reserve Training Units.

Candidates for the program are slated to be selected prior to Feb. 1, 1965.

Applicants for the program must

be high school graduates. They must also pass three written tests as well as a physical examination. The written tests will determine an applicant's clerical, arithmetic and overall aptitude capabilities.

Prospective candidates should be single and without dependents. Those under 21 years of age, must acquire the written consent of their parents or guardians before final approval of their applications can be made.

The 40 candidates accepted will undergo ten weeks of basic training in an all-SPAR company at the U. S. Naval Training Center, Bainbridge, Md., beginning Feb. 1, 1965. Chief Arnie M. Lawrence, 10 N. Main Street, Wilkes-Barre, Pa.
