SHOCKED PUPPIES By Dr. Phillip M. Hinze, Director Friskies Pet Food Research Center

Puppies are notorious chewers and favorite targets are often electric cords and plugs. When your puppy's teeth pen-etrate either of these he may be knocked unconscious. Since this is a fairly common occurrence, it's well to be familiar with emergency first

aid treatment.

If it's a slight shock and the puppy is only momentarily dazed, he'll probably recover in a short time himself. If it's a serious shock, he may have to be given artificial respiration, be lowered into a tub of cold water or given a few whiffs of ammonia. But act promptly. Some shocks can be


