Music Supervisor.

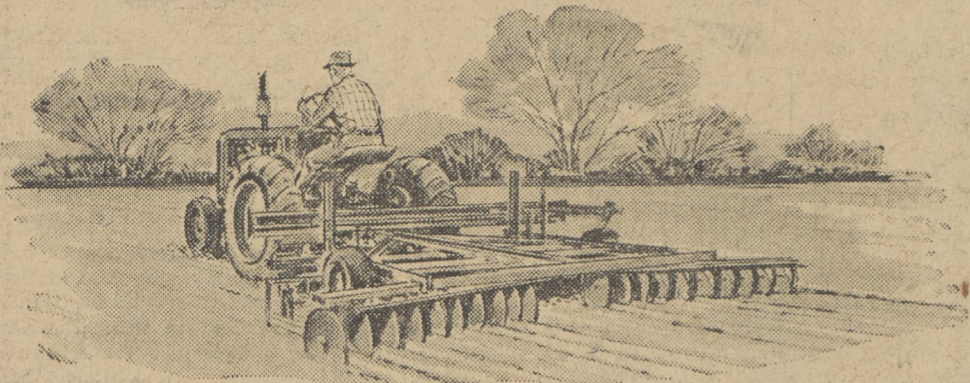
Mrs. Louise Colwell, principal of Dallas Elementary School, accompanied the group.

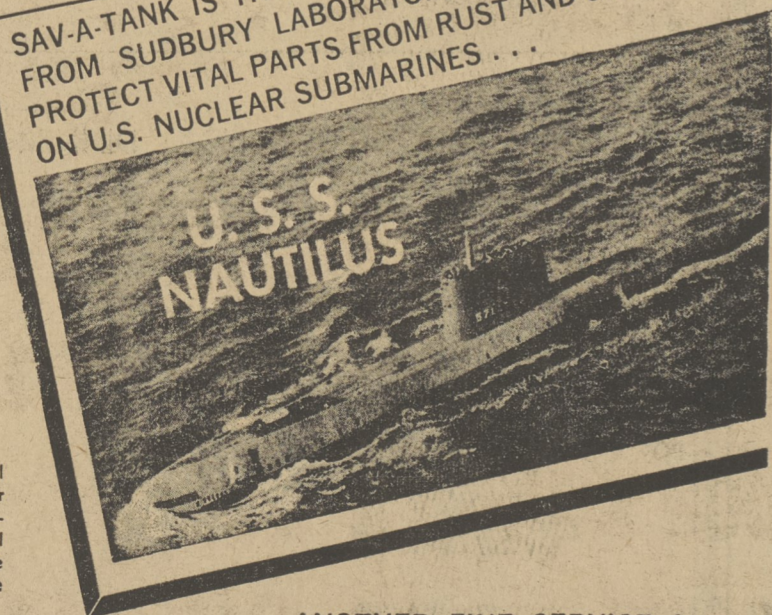
