The day is annually set aside by Church World Service for special attention to overseas relief, rehabilitation and interchurch efforts around the globe.

A department of the National Council of Churches, Church World Service is the overseas relief agency of major Protestant and Eastern Orthodox communions in this country.

Goals established by participating churches for emergency assistance and continuing service amounted to more than \$17,000,000 for 1965.

Over one fourth of the amount represents the goal of 11,500 congregations of the participating church bodies of the National Lutheran Council, the Lutheran Church in America and the American Lutheran Church. Through benevolence budgets and through especially designated gifts, their \$4,512,935 objective is undertaken by Lutheran World Action, the annual appeal of the N.L.C.

The special observance at St. Paul's was announced by Rev. Frederic H. Eider, who noted that the LWA represents a major item in the congregation's benevolence goal for this year. The Lutheran World Federation is a major recipient of LWA funds, an international body of 70 member churches whose activities include interchurch
