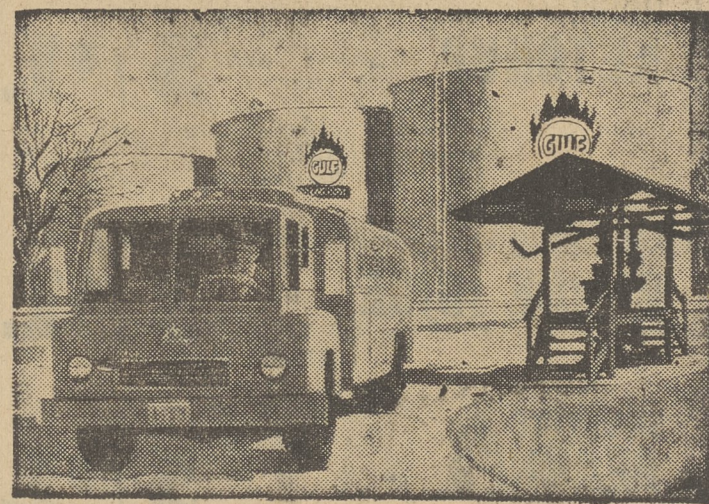
### David Glahn Makes Dean's List At Union

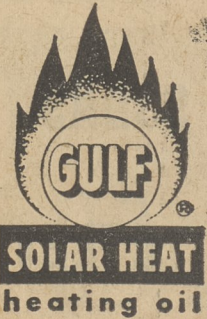

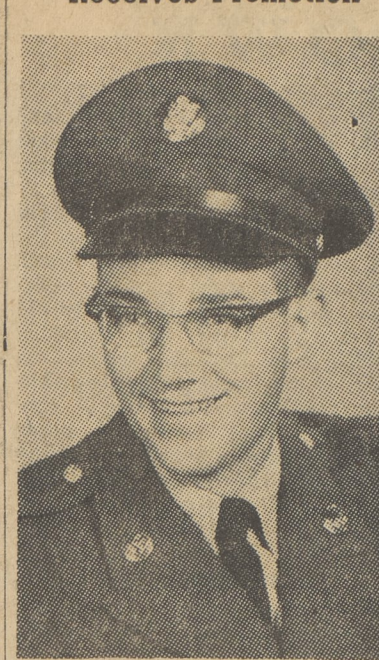
Past presidents are urged to attend, that they may be introduced.
