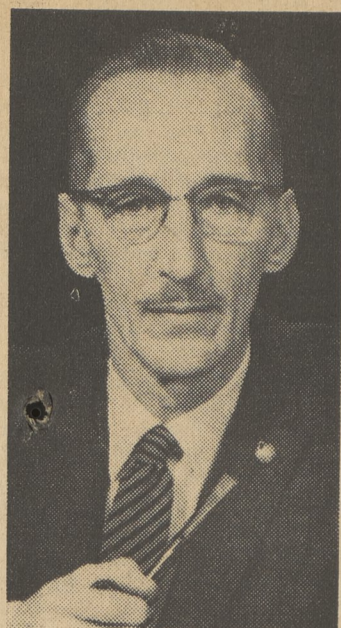


To Talk On Civil War
