Evangelical Church, by Rev. S. H. Chubb.

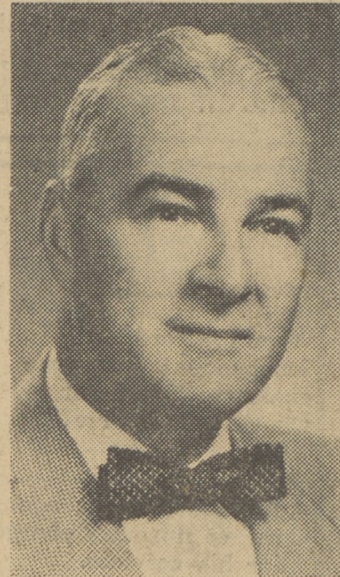
Mrs. Price is the former Viola Banks, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Bernard Banks, Wilkes-Barre.

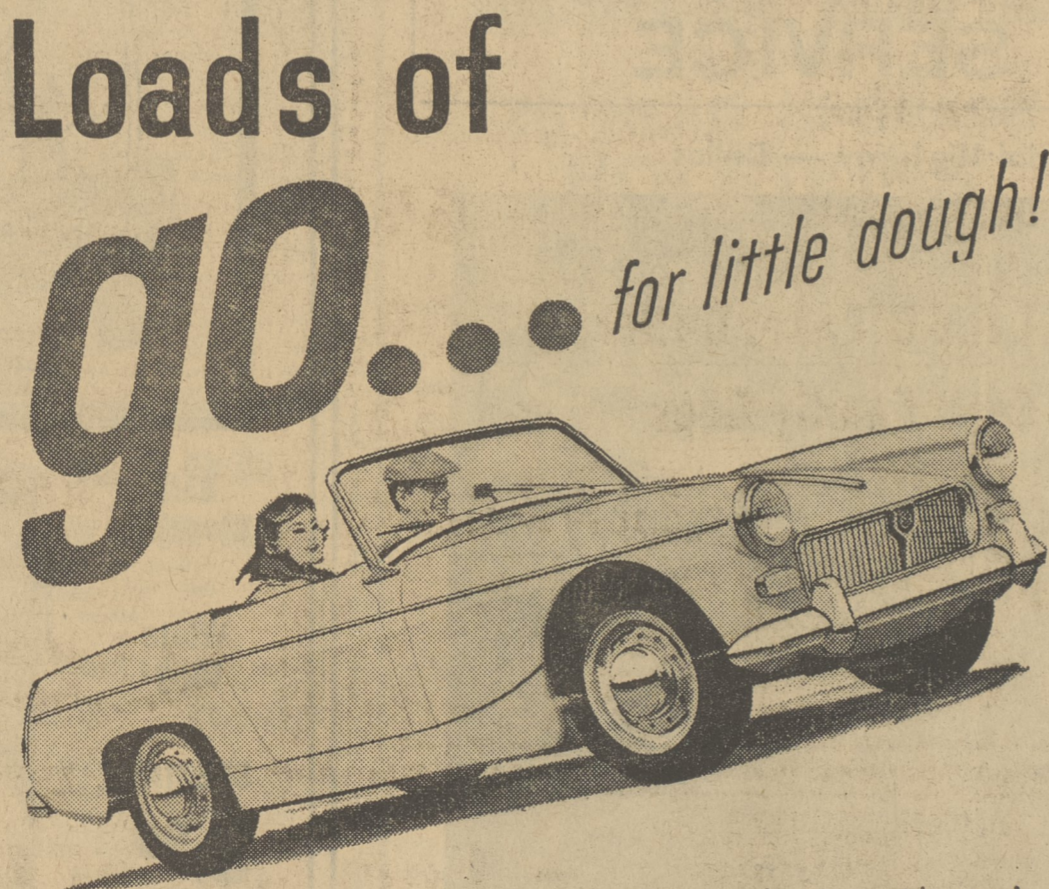

Supervisor Candidate

William Samuels, Lake Silkworth, is a Republican candidate for Lehman Township supervisor, running for re-election on Tuesday, May 18, for a six year term. Samuels, now president of the board of supervisors, has served in this capacity for two years, filling the unexpired term of Joseph Marchakitus, upon his resignation.

Mr. Samuels, retired, makes his home at Lake Silkworth and is actively interested in the welfare and advancement of Lehman Township and the entire area. An engineer by profession, Mr. Samuels is a graduate of Bucknell University; he held the post of assistant engineer for the Pennsylvania Department of Highways for a two year period; owned and operated an ice and coal business in Nanticoke for many years.

Mr. Samuels was a member of the Lehman Township School Authority during the building of the new school. He was instrumental in securing funds for the Township through the Accelerated Federal Works Program, whereby the Supervisors were able to build six miles of new blacktop road. He has been active in formulating the zoning laws of the Township which far-sighted citizens recognize as vital in the planning of the fast growing Back Mountain communities.

Mr. Samuels instituted the one mile salt road project, Konigus Road, Lake Silkworth, which is the first of its kind in the area and which has aroused much interest among road builders. Construction requires the blading up of the road and the application of 40 tons of salt per mile. It is then mixed with water, forming a brine when dry. Such a road, according to road building authorities, will outlast all other types of unsurfaced roadways. The experimental one mile section, built last Fall, has proven highly satisfactory thus far.
