No Bass Stocked Here This Year

While bass fingerlings have been stocked throughout the state in abundance this year, none have been sent as yet to Jim Yoder, District Fish Warden, Sweet Valley.

Mr. Yoder says he never gets more than a few days notice on when bass will be sent anyway, so he does not know if part of the Fish Commission's extensive 1965 bass stocking program is headed for northern Luzerne County.

Executive Director of the Commission Robert J. Bielo announced recently that more than 85,000 fingerlings had been stocked in state waters this year.

Large and smallmouth bass season opens June 19.

Mr. Yoder told the Dallas Post that the bass program is not nearly as extensive as the trout program, in which such popular waters as Harveys Lake, Silkworth, Bowman's Creek (another district), North Lake, and smaller streams are stocked each year on a "put and take" basis.

The bass program, he said, is simply a matter of getting fingerlings and grown bass when they are available, and replenishing the supply of bass from year to year depends in great part on their own propagation.

Bass come from a state hatchery at Pleasant Mount in Wayne County and are also bought by the Commission from commercial fisheries and from drawn reservoirs. They have to be netted on an availability basis.

Bass are not stocked in Harveys Lake, Mr. Yoder said, as this body of water is managed for trout only. But generally bass stocking is restricted to state waters and private ponds with public access.

Most recent local bass stocking was last year, two times at Bryants Pond. In the not too distant past, bass were stocked in Lake Jean also.

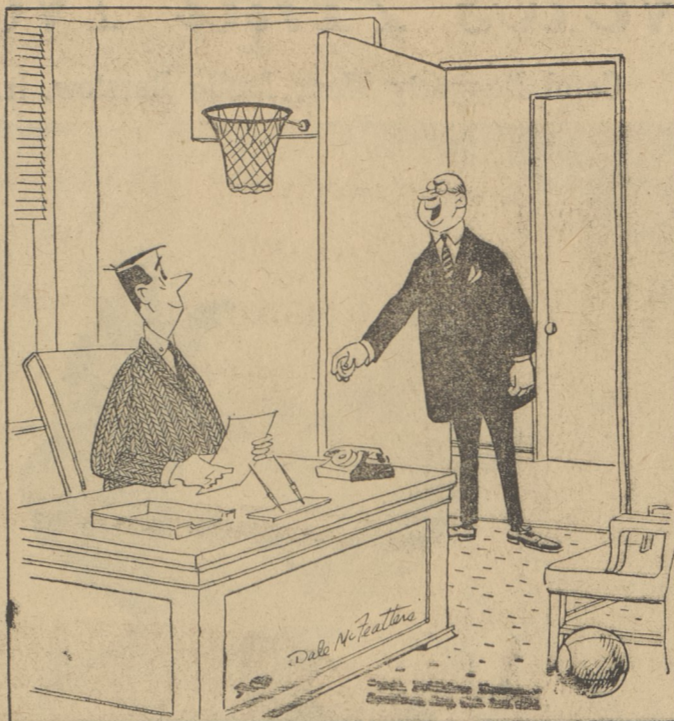
Fish Commission stocking in the next few weeks is restricted to muskunge, for the most part, according to Mr. Yoder.

Longer Shooting Hours Woodchuck Hunters

Woodchuck hunters are reminded that hours for shooting this popular summer target were extended with the coming of June. Hours for shooting woodchucks between June 1 and September 30 are from 7 a.m. until 8:30 p.m. (Eastern Daylight Saving Time).

The Pennsylvania Game Commission urges 'chuck' hunters to wear brightly colored clothing while pursuing this animal. Always watch for workers and machinery—and be sure of your backstop.

FARM CALENDAR

Thin Vine Crops: Vine crops in the vegetable garden do best if thinned to 2 or 3 plants in the hill or to stand 12 to 15 inches apart in the row, says Robert Fletcher, extension vegetable specialist at the Pennsylvania State University. Pinch or cut off plants to be discarded.

Sow Perennials: Seeds of biennials and perennials can be sown in June so that flowering next year will be assured, suggests A. O. Rasmussen, extension ornamental specialist at The Pennsylvania State University. Biennials which can be seeded now are lupine, sweet william, foxglove and canterbury bells. It is best to sow seeds in place, because many of these do not transplant easily. Perennials which can be planted are columbine, delphinium and Chinese pink.

Die Small Bulbs: Early in June small bulbs, such as crocuses, grape hyacinths and snowdrops can be dug up, separated, and dried in the sun or on the floor of your garage for a few days, advises A. O. Rasmussen, extension ornamental specialist at the Pennsylvania State University. Store them in strawberry boxes or flats; put them in a cool, dry place until October when they can be replanted in new locations.

Remove Faded Blooms: Remove faded blooms from perennials to prevent seeds from forming and sowing themselves in your garden, says A. O. Rasmussen, extension ornamental specialist at The Pennsylvania State University. Since most of the new desirable varieties are hybrids, they do not come true from seed, and new seedlings may be of an undesirable type.
