They have one son, Bernard D. Rogers of Shavertown.

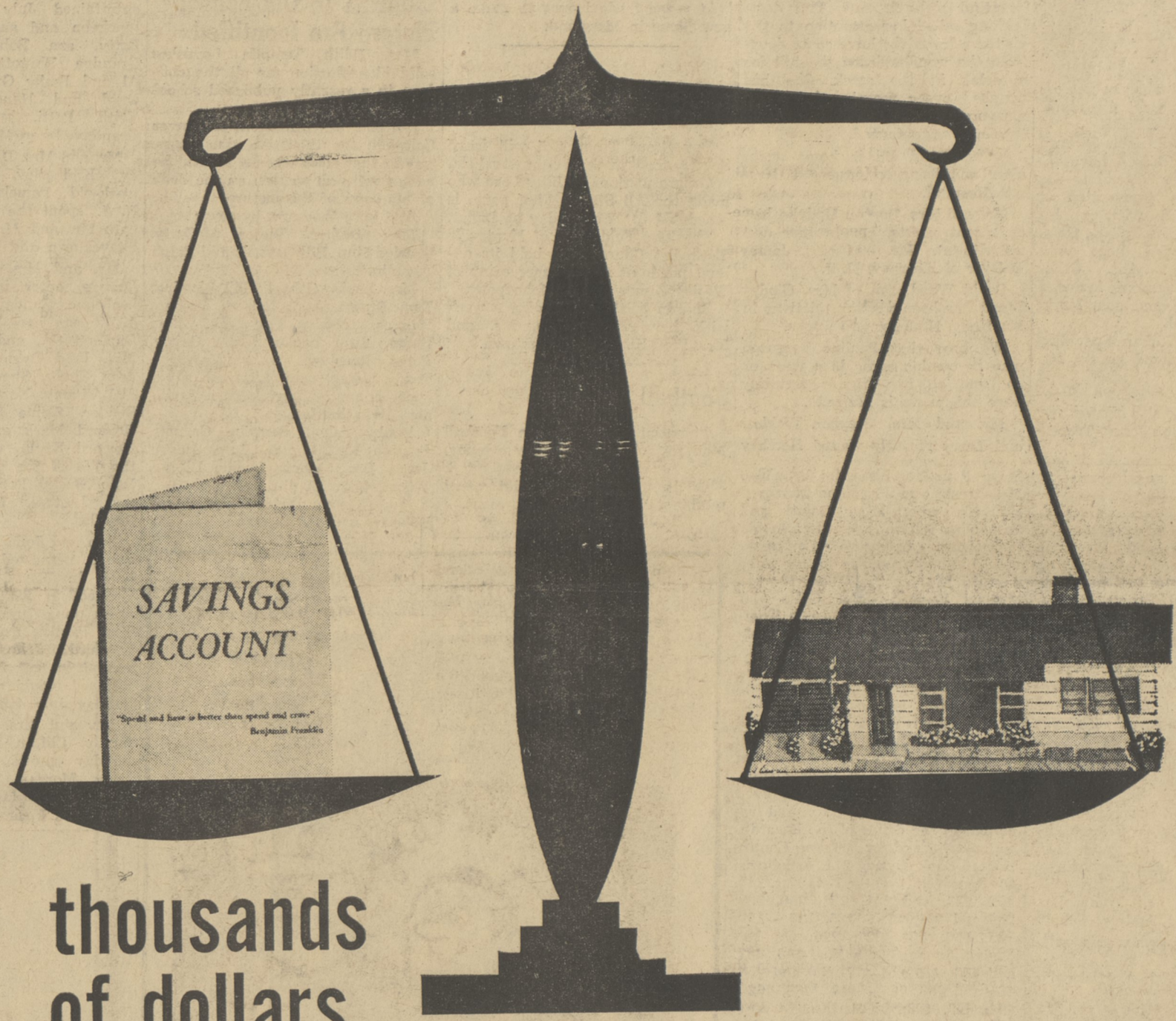
