## Clifton King, 78 Has Heart Attack

### Was Custodian For 54 Years At YMCA

Clifton S. King, 78, was buried Saturday morning in Forty-Fort following services conducted at 11 by Rev. James Cara from a Luzerne funeral home.

Only the briefest of notices could be written for last week's issue of the Dallas Post, as the news came at press time.

Mr. King had worked in a maintenance capacity for the YMCA for 54 years, forty-two of them at Central YMCA, twelve at the Back Mountain Branch.

Last October, he retired, but he did not give up his interest in the YMCA, where he was a constant visitor, and a member of the Retired Men's Club. It was at a meeting of this club, when playing billiards with his friends, that he was taken ill.

Leaving the YMCA building, he walked up the street to his lodgings in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Leslie Hoover, and collapsed outside his own door.

Shavertown ambulance crew administered oxygen, realized that death was imminent, and instead of taking him to the hospital, took him to Dr. Michael Bucan's office, where he was pronounced dead. Deputy coroner Richard Disque was called.

Robert Crosson, YMCA director, said, "We have suffered a great loss. He was greatly liked by everybody who came to the YMCA. He had been noticeably failing in health for the final two weeks of his life, but he still was an almost daily visitor, feeling that this was his life."

Mr. and Mrs. Russell Montedonio, next door to the Y, had encouraged Mr. King to set up his television set in their recreation room. He spent many hours in that household, providing the family atmosphere which a man of 78 needs.

He was born in Luzerne, son of the late John B. and Mary Evans. His wife, the former Geraldine Merrill, died in 1924.

He leaves two daughters, both of Luzerne, Mrs. Esther Heidel and Mrs. Mary Evans.
