Mr. and Mrs. Donald Wolfe took Mrs. LaBar on a delightful trip to Valley Forge, Bryn Mawr and Philadelphia.

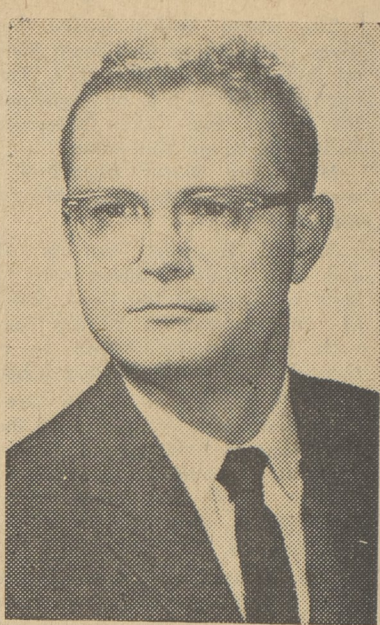
