## Mrs. Catherine Haas Dies At Age Of 88

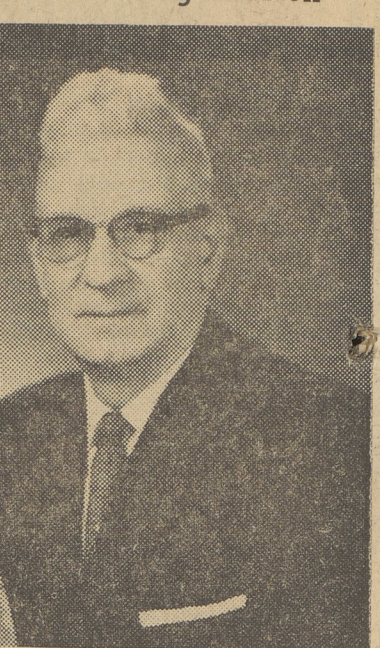
