The community was saddened last week by the death of Mrs. Gustav A. Kuehn, affectionately known to her friends and neighbors as "Jenn" one of the oldest living residents of Dallas; and with her passing went one of the last links between the merchants of old Dallas and the present day shopping centers.

Mr. and Mrs. Kuehn came to Dallas in 1913 with her son John A. Ammerman, and his young son, the late Karl Kuehn and daughter late Lydia Rohrbach, when the couple purchased the George Norton Drug Store. They worked as a team building a fine country business; and their store, along with Earl Monk's Plumbing and Ryman's Hardware and Lumber Stores, Bulford's Blacksmith Shop, C. A. Frantz's General Store, Chester White's Butcher Shop, Charlie Gregory's Barber Shop, John Reese's Coal and Feed Store, Gordon's Confectionery Store, Daddow's Wagon Repair Shop, were social centers where farmers gathered on Saturdays when they came to town to "pick up their orders" and spin tall yarns of the week's happenings around pot belly stoves.

The Kuehns were kindly and good neighbors. In those horse and buggy days, Mrs. Kuehn many times walked miles to deliver an order to a critical child or got out of bed with her husband to make up a prescription for an elderly friend.

She was one of the first presidents of the Pharmaceutical Auxiliary, was a charter member of Eastern Star, and a member of Dallas Methodist Church. The only church in the area then.

Mrs. Kuehn's avocation was politics. A devoted Republican all her life, she in later years became committee woman for the borough, then the county, then the state. She was a leader in every political rally, did an enthusiastic job of electioneering at the polls, and never failed to vote even when she was in the hospital or ill at home.

She is survived by her son, John A. Ammerman of Allentown, step grand sons, Frank Kuehn of Dallas, and Karl Rohrbach, Exton, Pa., and several nieces and nephews.

Private funeral services were held Saturday morning from an Edwardsville funeral home, Rev. Robert Sheehan officiating. Burial was in Langeliffe Cemetery, Avoca.
