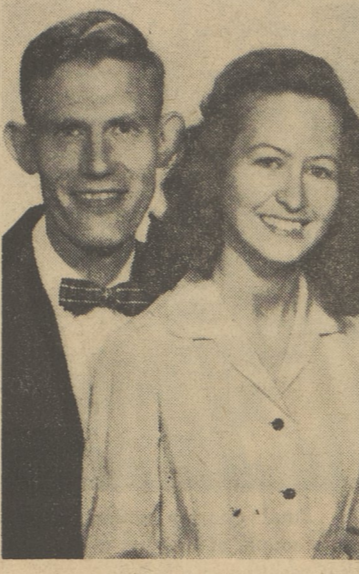

**Mrs. Ellen Deater, 77, Taught Sunday School**



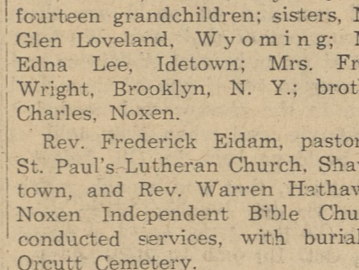

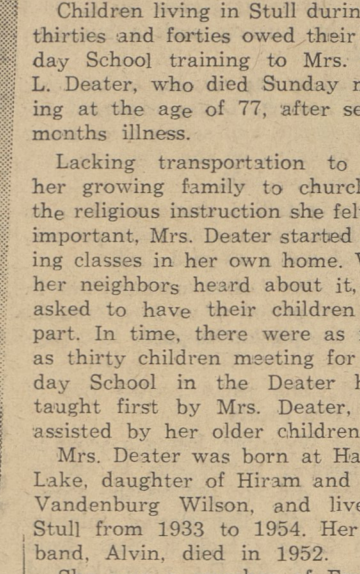

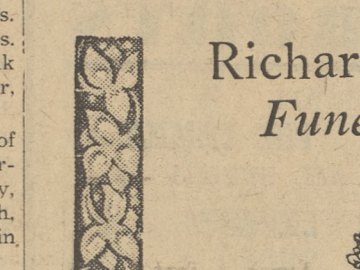
