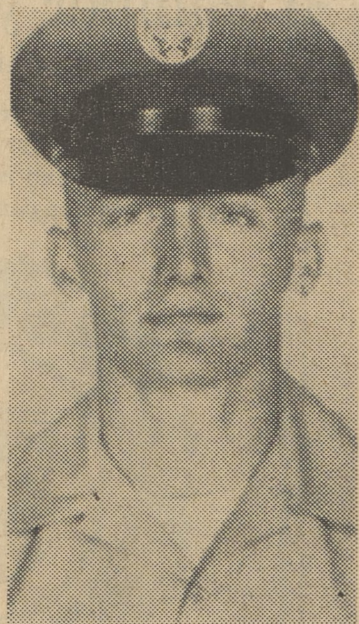

Airman Kirmse is a personnel specialist at Hancock Field, N. Y. He is a member of the Air Defense Command which protects the U. S. against enemy air attack.

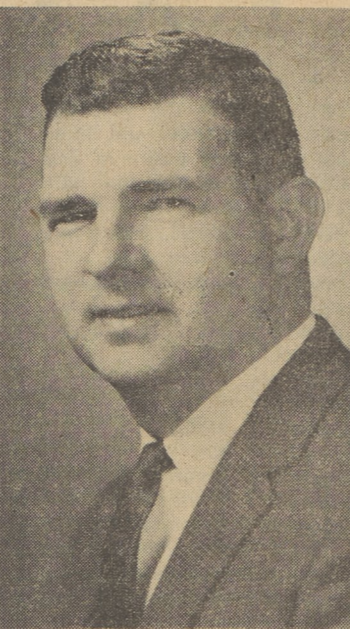

### Donald Evans Heads State Education Association

At the Forty-first Convention of Northeastern Region, Pennsylvania State Education Association, October 14 and 15, Shamokin High School, a Social Studies seminar was conducted on Friday. Over seventy teachers attended.

Edgar W. Hughes, Jr., World Cultures instructor at Dallas Senior High School, opened the meeting with election of officers: Donald J. Evans, president, member of Social Studies Department, Dallas Senior High School, and Robert Head, vice president, chairman of social studies at Shamokin High School.

Principal speaker, introduced by Mr. Hughes, was James G. Kehew, Social Studies Coordinator, Bureau of General and Academic Education, Department of Public Instruction, Harrisburg.

Mr. Kehew spoke of new content and new teaching approaches developing in Social Studies, of teaching by the inductive method rather than furnishing students with a wealth of facts for absorption and many times memorization. By inductive processes, the student would seek out for himself the answers to

certain situations or problems, and thereby retain much of what he had learned through personal research.

Mr. Kehew related that Carnegie Tech has introduced courses of study in the Social Studies which are now being tried in Pittsburgh, and are outlined as follows: In 9th grade there are two complete semesters of economic systems in several countries in addition to our own; 10th grade is devoted to World Cultures, or History, but on a case studies basis; 11th grade features American History, and 12th grade considers Sociology, Anthropology and other Social Science Disciplines. Independent student research is urged and highlighted at all times.

After the main speech, A. Thomas Schultz, Director of Susquehanna Valley Regional Instructional Materials Center, and a resident of Bloomsburg, distributed materials on new approaches to the study of geography relating to all areas of the world.

Adjournment of the session was called at 3:15 p. m. by the presiding officer.

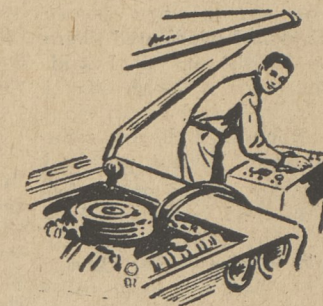

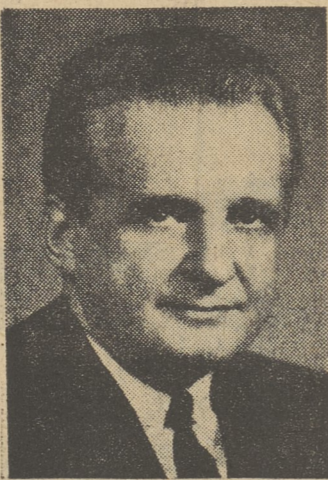
