

Prevue Of "Red Shoes" Brings Delighted Response From Adults

From the rise of the curtain to the last mad scamper of the cast down the aisle of Walsh Auditorium Thursday night, "Red Shoes" was fantastically delightful to an adult audience invited to prevue a performance intended for children.

The Hans Christian Anderson fairy tale came to life, with an ending tailored to fit an audience of youngsters, and music specially composed to carry out the theme, sometimes rollicking, sometimes tender, always enchanting.

Stellar honors go to the clown, Jemmo, who by pantomime, the oldest of the dramatic arts, swept the audience off its feet. Pantomime must be exaggerated to be convincing, just as puppets must be exaggerated to portray character.

Mary Pat McGeehan, College Misericordia sophomore, brought to the part of Jemmo a pixie humor and a disregard of the laws of gravity which was completely captivating.

When she flung herself at the Burgomaster, clinging like a burr to his brawny chest, it appeared to be as much of a surprise to him as it was to the audience.

It took much practice on the part of Leighton Scott, skillfully aged into an elderly and paunchy Burgomaster, to receive the small bundle of happiness with such apparent dismay..... dismay which changed suddenly to sheepish delight.

The grandmother, in a tall and befuddled hat, appeared to tower over the Burgomaster. This part was played by Sandra Postupack, who scurried about the stage in a skillfully exaggerated effort to find her lost granddaughter.

Karen, the lost orphan, a dainty dancer who finds that the gift of a pair of magic red shoes carries with it implications which are more than meet the eye, a spell of evil cast by a wicked gypsy, was deftly portrayed by Anne Hurley.

The part of Snogg is taken with tremendous verve and sinister overtones by a Dallas High School senior, who is also rehearsing for his own senior play, but finding no difficulty in keeping his parts distinct. "When I'm Snogg," he says, "I think Snogg. When I'm Daniel Tenyson, I'm Dan . . . and a perfect stinker."

Bob Graham is a perfect stinker in "Red Shoes," as well as in the forthcoming performance of "The Perfect Idiot." He moves stealthily about the stage with all the grace of a ballet dancer, but with none of the charm.

It is easy to hate the gypsy, and easy to applaud when the Red Shoes with which he has bewitched the little orphan, vanish in a puff of blue smoke.

Nels, the sterling young cobbler who is in love with Karen, is played by another Dallas High School senior, Tim Houlihan.

There is an inspiring cops-and-

robbers sequence in the last act, one which is guaranteed to give children in the audience a comic thrill and chill.

Bouquets for Annette Oshinskie and Ann Giacalone, who composed and presented the accompanying musical score.

A big build-up for set designers Carol Polack, Walter D. Andersen and Maureen Purcell, whose village and Gypsy camp scenes were contrived with the minimum of trappings and the maximum of effectiveness. The camp fire, glowing in the dark, was especially effective.

Dancers were Ann Hurley, Noreen O'Leary, Barbara Urban, Donna Marie Sus and Rosemary Stefanowski, all adept in rustic dancing as well as in the floating and graceful Gypsy dance sequence.

Direction is by Ann Marie Shea, of Misericordia's Speech and Drama faculty.

Technical director is Walter C. Andersen; stage manager Pat Alberque, assisted by Kathy Maher, Ann Burke, Carol Saus, and Patricia Whelan; violinist at the Gypsy camp, Carolyn Depinto.

Costume design is in the hands of Ann Marie Shea, execution by Kathy Kelley and Magdalena Piller, and an exceptionally good job. There are no sour notes.

Too often the stage crew is blanked out with no voice of praise from press or audience. Always, a smooth performance depends upon the assist from the wings. In charge of lights, extremely important in a play where an illusion must be maintained throughout, was Ruth Miszier. In charge of props, Maureen Voight.

And in back of it all, a sympathetic faculty of dedicated Sisters, a faculty which realizes that College Misericordia is an integral part of Dallas and of the broader Wyoming Valley community, graciously extending many cultural opportunities to residents.

Junior League of Wilkes-Barre collaborated with College Misericordia in presenting Red Shoes. Next weekend will see further performances of the classic fairy-tale, gentled for children by Robin Short.


