

Fair-time In Old Dallas



When the Dallas Post put out the 75th anniversary tabloid of historical photos, it was said that there were no photographs of the Dallas Fair in our possession. Well, in the meantime, Clark Oliver of Noxen sent us a couple and here they are: Top one shows cattle waiting to be judged in the ring, judges peering down toward the camera from their fringed tower.

Lower shows a very fine old merry-go-round, and girls, see what they wore in those days.

First Dallas Fair was in 1886, and soon became known all over, being along the lines of a regular county fair today. It continued except for years 1906 to 1908 until about 1914.

Fairgrounds were located beyond the high school and present William Street and covered 40 acres of the old 500 acre Honeywell holdings. It was William J. "Squire" Honeywell who sold the land to the Dallas Union Agricultural Association. (By the way, Squire Honeywell was said to have been the first white child ever born in the Dallas area.) People came to Dallas on the Lehigh Valley Railroad and travelled the rest of the way by horse and wagon, and it was reported they made some classic traffic jams winding up the old dirt road to the grounds. On Friday of the one week of fairtime attendance would be as much as 5000 or 6000 people.

Featured attractions were trotting races on a half mile track. Women could take home blue ribbons for their baking, needlework, jellies, and produce. And the bands — Dallas or Alexander's from Wilkes-Barre, played on.

The boys would get so excited about the trotting races that they would race their own horses and wagons back to the farm at night, often with spectacular results and
