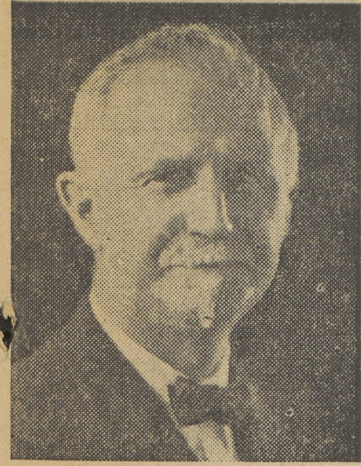


Forecast For 1966

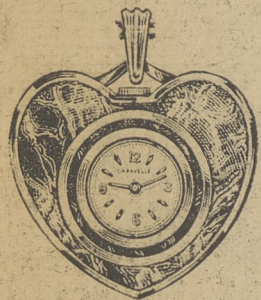
His exertions, however, undermined his health; he contracted tuberculosis and he was sent West "as good as dead".

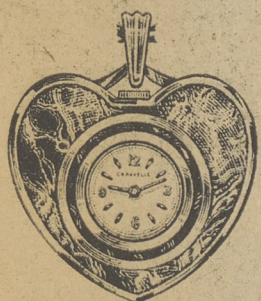
Mr. Babson has probably done more than any other man to create among his millions of newspaper readers an interest in simple business problems, and to instill a

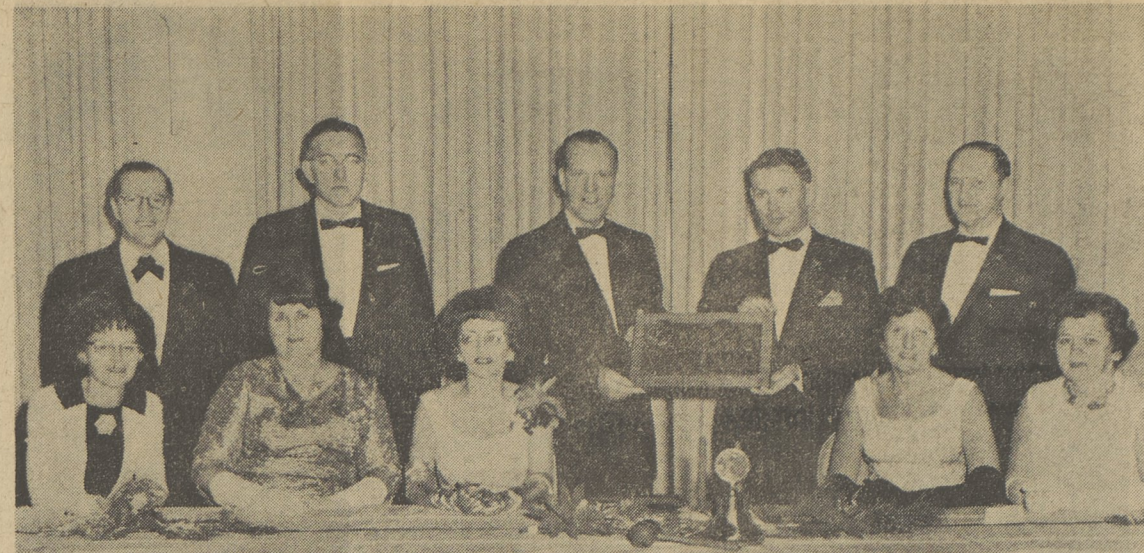

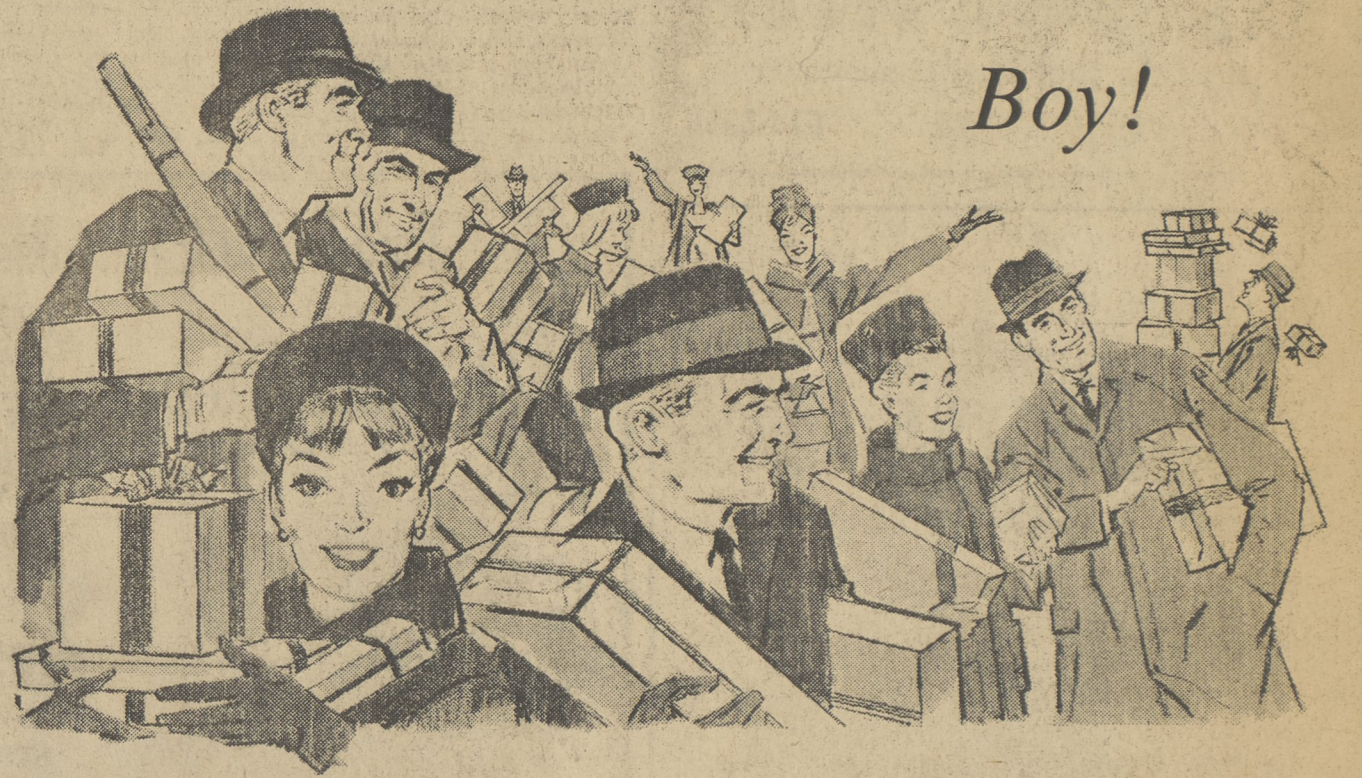
