

New Curator At Hawk Mountain

Appointment of Alexander C. Nagy as Curator of Hawk Mountain Sanctuary was announced today by Peter Edge, President of the non-profit association which operates the sanctuary. The appointment is effective May 1, upon the retirement of Maurice Brown who has directed the 2,000 acre wildlife refuge since its establishment 31 years ago.

Nagy came to the sanctuary in 1953 from employment with Bethlehem Steel Corporation because of his lifetime interest in wild animals and the out-of-doors. He quickly established his place at the sanctuary in friendly contact with thousands of visitors and the annual count of migrating hawks at the Lookout. He was born in Allentown, graduating from Fountain Hill High School in 1943 and attending the Kings Point Merchant Marine Academy. After 3 years on active duty with the U. S. Navy he returned to Berks County to help with the family's farm near Kempton and married a hometown girl, the former Arlene Newman. With their two children, Alex Jr. and Melanie, the family lives on Hawk Mountain Sanctuary, Route 2, Kempton.

The new Curator is skilled in nature photography and is well known through his natural history lectures in eastern Pennsylvania. He has participated in research through banding of birds and co-operation with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service investigations on the effects of pesticides on wildlife. A current project is his inquiry into nesting density and breeding success of the Sparrow Hawk. This bird, so useful in controlling insects and mice on farms, had been greatly reduced by intensive clean farming practices in Berks County. Nagy has put up hundreds of nesting boxes for the attractive little falcon and is studying the bird's response to these changed conditions.

He has been assigned to Camp Lejeune, N. C. for four weeks of individual combat training and four weeks of basic specialist training in his military occupational field.

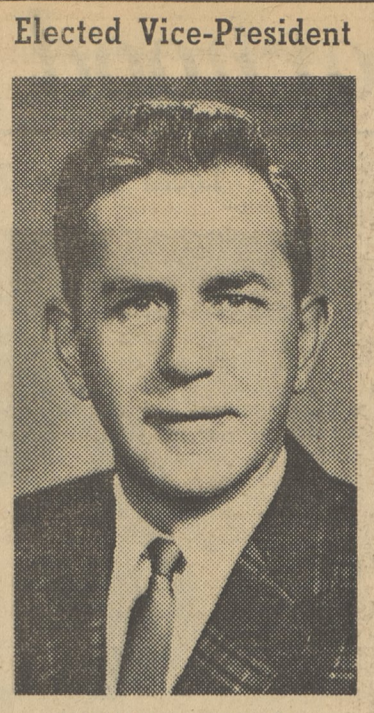
Harmony Club Meets
